A.A.A. OF W.A. REPORT - JULY 1983.

Eric Parker was unable to attend the June meeting of the above Association and unfortunately I was not able to be present until later in the night so I am not able to report on the earlier portion of proceedings.

Laurie Birchall reported on the Fishing Clinic currently being held at Leederville Town Hall. He said that attendance are close to 400 Persons per night and that the Association has benefitted by some \$2,500.00 and still more to come.

The Association currently is very healthy financially and it was decided to help any club affiliated with financial assistance to purchase gear etc. or in the form of a loan. Clubs to contact the Association if they wish to take advantage of the offer.

Copies of the Western Australian Anglers' Magazine are now available and will be tabled at our next club meeting FREE. The Association is looking at producing the next issue themselves and have guaranteed \$1,000 to produce it as long as they can get three people to produce it. The advertising will cover this cost and the Association will only have to pick up the short - fall, if any.

As from the September meeting the venue for the delegates' meeting of the above Association will be the Marmion Angling and Aquatic Club, Marmion.

South Suburban Club requested that the legal length of Mulloway to stay at the old 40cm instead of the new State legal length of 33cm. It was pointed out to this club there is nothing to prevent clubs from setting their own legal lengths if they wish as long as they are the same, or exceed, State Legal Lengths. The Association complies to State Legal Lengths.

The 112 gram and 56 gram sinkers moulds will soon be available and the 84 gram is being cast now.

The dates for the 1983 Open and Team State Drycasting Championships will be on Saturday and Sunday, 24th & 25th September at the Yokine Reserve, Yokine.
