From Derry Barber, nominee for the position of President of the Surfcasting and Angling Club of WA (Inc) at the Annual General Meeting on Wednesday 12th August at the Les Hansmen Community Hall, Walter Rd, Morley (opposite Coventry's).

To become the future President of Surfcasters, I Derry Barber ask for your vote and support based upon the following policy statement:

**POLICY STATEMENT****Current Membership Statistics:-**

Although Reel Talk has a publication of currently 60 listings (which include authorities, clubs etc) actual club members number 45 with approximately 20 of said members actively participating in club events.

Policy statement on membership is to immediately commence a drive for new members to which 5 methods are held in readiness. As much as we need to attract new members it will not prove fruitful unless we retain a reasonable percentage of the new recruits which then leads to the next segment.

**Buddy System:-**

To establish a buddy system to which a format is prepared for presentation to the new committee and will as any area proposed be required to obtain the vote of members at a general or special meeting prior to implementing same. This system should ensure that the interest, education and assistance provided by the designated members concerned will retain most of the new recruits.

**How Many Members?-**

We are a relatively small club and as such will need to spread recruiting over a period of time with no more than say 5 new members aimed for a given recruiting drive as we simply don't have enough existing active members to work the Buddy System.

**Club Meeting Venue:-**

It will be proposed to obtain a larger area with better acoustics in the same general vicinity and a venue able to be considered on a long term basis as our focal point.

**Club Meetings:-**

A revised format chaired to engender interest, be entertaining, promote education and introduce an element of competition and fund raising as follows.

**Introduction of Indoor Dry Casting:-**

To promote more interest at meetings and introduce an element of competition which will also assist the club with fund raising. It is proposed that indoor dry casting be introduced at all or intermittent club meetings.

Equipment has been donated by Derry Barber who has commissioned George Holman to build three special indoor dry casting rods for this particular purpose.

**Reel Talk:-**

Recommendation to be put to the committee and in turn club members for consideration to both format, standard segments and feasibility of continuing to self produce.

**Retention of Members:-**

Following up members who are dropping out of club events. To become a role within the committee aimed to encourage and foster member participation in club events and ascertain reasons for non attendance for subsequent attention and action.

The Committee:-

We need new blood, new enthusiasm we need you in particular some of the new members. The future is what we make it, think not what your club can do for you but what you can do for your club. Shared field days or competitions with other clubs to be considered to engender competition and interest and promote fellowship through competing as a club.

Field Days and Social Events:-

Sub Committee to prepare a report considerations in hand for basis of initial areas of discussion.

In Conclusion:-

No matter how well researched the plan may be or the enthusiasm of the persons concerned unless there is a strong chairperson who can ensure the plan is completed and maintained the plan itself is not self fulfilling.

A vote for Derry Barber as President is a vote for a person sufficiently dedicated and with the experience and strength of character to perform the role of chairperson and President.

RECIPESMACKEREL CUTLETS with HERB-LEMON BUTTER

Ingredients:

- 1 Tablespoon Butter
- 2 Tablespoons Lemon Juice
- 2 Tablespoons Chopped, fresh mixed herbs eg.  
parsley, chives, thyme, rosemary,  
sage etc.
- 4 Mackerel Cutlets, weighing about 750 gram total  
Ground black pepper to taste

Method: Place butter and lemon juice in a large, shallow Microwave dish. Microwave on HIGH for 2 minutes. Add cutlets, cover and cook on MEDIUM-HIGH for 7 minutes, turning once during cooking. Transfer cutlets to a serving plate. Stir herbs and pepper into the hot butter and lemon juice; spoon over cutlets and serve at once.

MACKEREL - "ADRIATIC STYLE"

Ideal for: Barbeque, Grilling or Frying.

Ingredients:

- 1 kg Fresh Mackerel fillets
- 1/2 cup Olive oil
- 1/2 cup White wine
- 1 sprig Parsley
- 2 cloves Garlic
- Pinch Pepper and salt

Method: Slash the skin of the fillet in two to three places. Marinate for 30 minutes in a mixture of white wine, olive oil, parsley, salt, freshly ground pepper and chopped garlic. Grill or cook on a hot well-oiled barbeque for 7-10 minutes, serve with a lemon.
