Disputes may be taken to the committee.

Entries for Game Fish Badge, Club Records and Open Fishing Competitions must be lodged with the Recorder within 30 days of capture.

AUSTRALIAN ANGLERS ASSN. WA DIVISION REPORT

Ivan Edwards & George Holman were our two delegates in attendance at the July Delegates Meeting, held at the Sportsman Assn Hall, Mt Lawley. There were some twenty six persons in attendance & a good deal of business was dealt under the chairmanship of Ric Hammond.

New rules are to be brought in to deal with the illegal fishing that has been going on, particularly in the river. The proposal is for a fine of \$3000 for the offence & 10 times the commercial value of the excess over the State bag limits. This would be a step in the right direction.

Northern Districts Club queried State casting records at club events. They were of the opinion that this was not on & had to be cast at State or National events. I have been casting for 30 years & to my knowledge it has always been for State records that all casting events to qualify had to be notified to the Association prior to the event. Our club has sent in a calendar of events & sends a copy of this magazine each month as well. National records can only be obtained at National events (once every two years). This principle is available to all clubs & I always thought we were trying to encourage casting not shaft it. Our club also has an open invitation to all members of other clubs who wish to participate, & we also carry public liability insurance.

Lindsay Harbord, Federal Convention President for the Geraldton Carnival gave a full report & presented the balance sheet for the recent National Carnival (at the end of this report). He spoke at length & thanked all who participated & helped & also made the following recommendations:

- (a) Fund raise \$20,000 at least, toward the next carnival in 8 - 10 years for this state;
- (b) The \$350 still in the Gold Account to remain & be the kick off for the next carnival & be called the 2005 Carnival Account.

George Holman gave a report on the drycasting meeting held at our meeting hall on the 10th July. An attendance of approx 12 persons & good interest shown & more involvement likely from other casters. A programme of 12 months experimenting & practice, 6 months trial selection & 6 months preparation for the teams selected to go away. We are looking for a 200 metre surveyors chain to help with the marking. State championships to be held at Yokine Reserve on Sunday 26th November. Gear in the trailer from Geraldton was literally thrown in & will have to be totally gone through again.

Motion re; teams in State events: that all team members including reserves to validate a team & the lowest result be dropped & not be included, was carried. Clubs may nominate one team in each section.

The forthcoming motion on club members only being able to compete for their club in State events was discussed. Most were in favour of this & it was pointed out that it is possible for people to join a club on the day of the event!!

Lindsay Harbord pointed out that the Recreation Fishing Council will be very important for the future fishing & will be our strongest avenue of representation when dealing with State matters.

Laurie Birchell & Allan Cuthbert gave a preliminary report on their research & forthcoming submission re fishing platforms along our metro coast.

President asked that funding be sought to run a seminar for Presidents & Secretaries of all clubs with a view of looking at our Association & its future direction.

Association needs to look at making money available to send two delegates to mid-term Convention meeting at Rainbow Beach next year. Approx \$2000 needed - look for funding.

The WA Division Presentation of awards night will be held at the Sportsman Assn. Hall, Mt Lawley, on Saturday 2nd September. Any club member may attend.
