We had a visitor on the day by the name of Allan Davies, who I have been trying to get for quite some time to come along to have a cast. He has always sounded quite interested, so I am hoping to see more of him in the future.

Some interesting scores in the vets double handed accuracy with the lowest being 131. Bob Henderson took out the honors with 153 followed by myself with 148.

There were 4 bull's-eyes on the day, Geoff Raftis had one in the double handed accuracy, Bob Henderson had 2 in the double handed and 1 in the single handed accuracy. Bob and Gary shared first place in the single handed accuracy with 27.

In the Vets distance I had the longest 56gr at 133 and 137m. The artificial went to myself with 118m and Gary with 103m. I had the longest 112gr with 151 and 145m.
