This is one of the field days not to be missed; its close to home and has a good stretch of beach to fish.

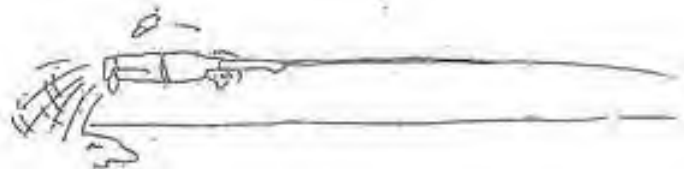

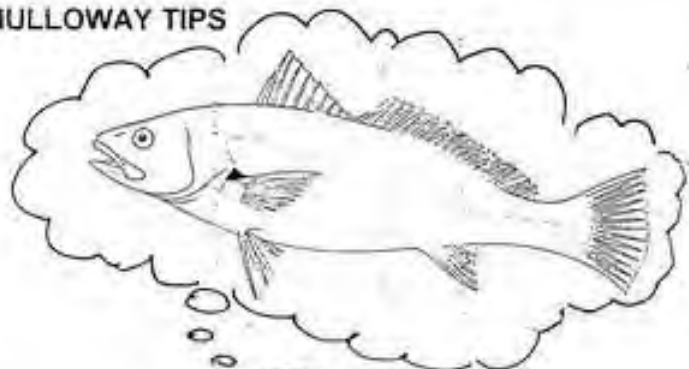

### MY BIGGEST CATCH



In 1973 I was serving in the Department of National Parks and Wildlife Management in Rhodesia. I was the Executive Officer in charge of Personnel. My duties included travelling to all the National Parks in the country.

September that year saw me at Mana Pools, the world renowned game reserve in the Zambezi Valley. I was to attend a departmental meeting and made sure I would take some time for game viewing and also a spot of fishing. It's the type of place where you keep one eye in front for crocodiles and the other eye behind for Rhino's and Hippo's and whatever else may be lurking.

On arrival, getting our priorities right, we first ground baited a suitable fishing place in the back water off the main Zambezi River. In Rhodesia, we used "MASESS" for ground bait. It is a fermented grain, the dregs from brewing native beer. It is sour and smells pretty foul. Anyway it works like whale oil in pollard here.

By 5pm, the Director, his Deputy and myself were very busy catching Zambezi Bream weighing up to 1.5kg. Next morning, we were back at sunrise to get a few more fillets for the freezer. We had about a dozen fish in the keep net when I hooked into a good size fish. I was bringing it in gently, then next thing, there were hundreds of tiny bubbles rising to the surface, about 3 metres away, just where my fish was.

The Deputy said I must have caught a large bottlenose (a fish native to the Zambezi which expels air when hooked). With that, the fish started a strong run and rapidly took line. There was no way I could hold it with my 4kg line. After about 50 metres had been stripped. The Director said "you had better stop it Roy or it will go straight up the other bank." He had no sooner said it, when an eight foot crocodile, complete with my fish in it's mouth emerged from the water. My line was clearly visible, rod tip to croc mouth. It devoured my bream with a clap of it's jaws, and with that, my line parted and the croc slithered back into the water.

Not surprisingly, the fish went right off the bight with the croc still cruising the surface, so we trooped off for breakfast. The large metal mesh keep net was securely tethered to a tree, so as to keep our dozen fish alive. When we returned about half an hour later, we found the keep net had been attacked by the croc. It was crushed out of shape and half the fish has been literally pulverised. At least we still has a few fish to fillet but with the croc still hanging around we had no option but to pack up. In reflection, It was just a swell my line snapped as I don't think I could have retrieved my hook, had I landed my biggest catch !

## Cooks Corner

Orange and Tomato  
Stuffing.  
( Whole Snapper )



30g butter.  
1 clove garlic  
1 tab/spn freshly  
chopped parsley.

3 shallots fine chopped.  
1 large orange segmented  
30g stale b'crumbs  
1 kg whole fish.

Debone the fish. Melt the butter and cook the shallots and garlic for a couple of mins. Remove from heat and mix in the rest of the ingredients. Stuff into fish.

Wrap in completely sealed alfoil, until fish starts to flake.

**Butter.** Soften 125g butter, while adding 3 t/spoons grated orange peel, 1 tab/spoon orange juice and 2 t/spoons tomato sauce. Spinkle over with freshly ground, black pepper. Form as a sausage in alfoil wrap and refrigerate when needed. Cut into slices

### **FIELD DAY RULES**

Sign on and weigh in times must be observed. Failure to do so may result in loss of points and report to the committee.

Members and visitors are not to leave the sign on area until dismissed by the Field Day Officer.

If driving on the beach, Tyres should be let down to at least 18psi to alleviate beach and track damage.

Flags and poles must be mounted on vehicles when travelling on tracks and sand dunes.

Boundaries and times set by the Field day officer must be adhered to. Failure to do so could result in loss of points.

Fish with 2 rods maximum in water at any given time.

Intentional Jag hooking of fish is not allowed.

Minimum length for any fish weighed in on club field days is 200mm (20cm) or as listed by the Fisheries Department.

Fish must be gilled and gutted.

Disqualification of total bag may occur for undersized fish.

Fish are not to be brought to the weigh in plastic bags. Hessian or cloth bags are acceptable. Disqualification of bag may occur.

Shovel Nose, Wobbygong, Port Jackson Sharks, Stingrays and Blowfish are not acceptable at the weigh in.

See rule book for full list of unacceptable species.

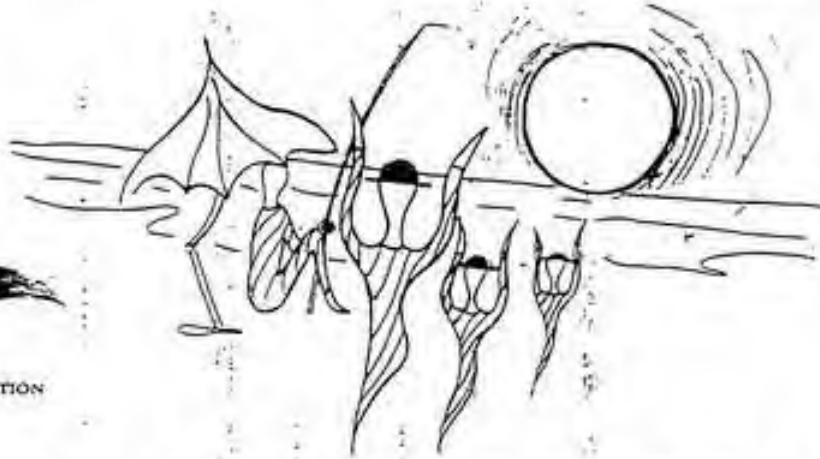
