George Michael - a New Zealander who was over for the Bunbury '85 Championships - a gun Kiwi fisherman who is an exponent of overhead reels. I had John Quinn along, a work associate who just arrived from the east coast - a fly fishing fanatic.

While not the most memorable trips with respect to fish caught, some interesting highlights were:-

Weather was surprisingly warm on Saturday thank goodness eh Sid!.

As you know when Sid does anything he does it in style.

Early evening George hooked a good "Woppie" on a overhead gear and gave him a bit of tussle, hadn't seen one before so wanted to land it. He was fishing on a rocky outcrop (Bunkers Bay) that he had to wade a few paces to reach.

Sid gets out the long gaff - George yells hurry up. Sid replies - no hurry I don't want to fall in. I'll be there in a moment.

Hope you've got the mental picture. Sid about to delicately, on his ippy tippy toes, stepped across to gaff this - in George's eyes - magnificent Woppie. You guessed it.
.....SPLASH.....

John and I look around - Sid's spread eagled in the drink - don't know who was making the biggest splash, Sid or the Woppie.

Good job we had the warm night. But this event does not end there.

Sid eventually did his trick, gaffed the Whoppie and hauled it in - (George still dancing across the rocks like a ballerina).

We mentioned to George these fish die slowly and should be put back - no George wants to fillet them, knows they are good tucker.

Fish wriggles around, George picks it up by the tail (1½ metres)

Prior to this interlude, we had been getting a few odd Herring (undersized fish and Buffies being returned but were the bulk of the catch between the odd Herring).

Knowing that Samson and Sea Kingies were habitents, although only infrequent visitors to this shallow water, John and I put out heavier rods with a live bait.

I rigged up and had a Skippy out for an hour or so. John followed suit, threw out a Skippy that was nearly dead, then proceeded to set up the rod in the rocks.

Things didn't seem quite right. Slack line then - tight line - then reel revolving at 10,000 rpm and a Skippy heading seawards with the spool being stripped of line at a phenominal rate, John's attempt to slow this down resulted in a break off. Would have been a good fish. We fished canal rocks the following morning.

John again did a similar trick with a live bait - this time the fish spat the hook.

Not a good success rate but showed a newcomer to the W.A. beach scene the potential.

We only caught a few more Herring plus I caught a leather jacket and banded sweep. No Salmon showed up. Reports from other clubs indicated Salmon didn't come in anywhere around the Cape area.

I have not fished this area much, looked at a few new spots - Windmills, The Cape, Canal Rocks and Sugarloaf these were noted as future places to visit given the right weather conditions. The swell was fairly high on the south side of Cape Naturlist, particularly Sunday - by then a small front had appeared, no heavy rain but showers enough to get a bit damp.
