

Bluff Creek Field Day 27/28 Feb/1 March 2010

Members at the February General meeting accepted the Committee's recommendation the "March" long weekend Field Day be to Bluff Creek, east of Albany.

DO NOT MISS THIS FIELD DAY!!. If you don't own a 4WD then ask another member for a lift. This is a FAMILY Field Day location so bring your wife or partner, friends and children or as a last option your dog. This is one of the best locations we go to for a club field day.

As in past years, a barbecue will be held from 12 noon Sunday to 2:00pm Sunday. It's a great time for socialising with your fellow club members and yet another highlight of the Bluff Creek field day when we go back to how field days used to be "in the good old days".

It has all the right ingredients for a great weekend. The camp site is protected from a lot of the wind and is near a fresh water creek, great for washing. You do need to take fresh water for drinking, tea making etc.

The weather can vary from drizzle to perfect to very hot, but most days there's a strong breeze and that's usually from the left along the beach.



Kilometres of beaches like this !!!!

Bluff Creek is east of Albany and is only accessible by 4WD. Once there, access to the camp site can be along the beach or through the dunes above the beach, which is usually reasonably easy, although getting off the beach to the camping area with a loaded trailer can need a good run up.

There are kilometers of open beach for fishing. Some reef fishing spots are within easy distance of the camping area. A long or good casting rod is a great asset as the trevally sometimes congregate around the offshore reefs. This is where your dry casting practice comes into good use for distance and placing the bait accurately.

The beaches and water are in pristine condition so it is really a very pleasant spot to just relax and enjoy the outdoors. We recommend this Field Day to all new members as the fishing is easy and there will be plenty of experienced members on hand to help.

Usually a group of members go down in convoy to Bluff Creek on the Friday morning so anyone wishing to join in please raise this at the General Meeting.

How to get to Bluff Creek

There are two main ways to get to Bluff Creek.

The simplest way is, with no map needed:- From Mount Barker, go towards Albany, turn left into Millbrook Road, 17 km to King River, left onto the South Coast Highway (Albany-Jerramungup Road) to Manypeaks, 6 km more to Cheyne Beach Road, 7 km more to Bluff Creek Road (gravel) on the right, 9 km in on Bluff Creek Road to the start of the 4WD track to the beach. Stop here and let down your tyres.

An alternative which uses several gravel roads and needs a good local map, is to take the Porongorup Road from Mount Barker to the Chester Pass road, use Mindijup road until you cross a ford over the Kalgan River. Find your way onto Fish Track Road to the South Coast Highway. From here, it's 5 km to Manypeaks, and on to Bluff Creek as above.

Fuel. Manypeaks has fuel but only during shop hours, and closes at 5 pm most days. If you intend traveling at night, the Mount Barker service station used to close at 10pm. Check for yourself before relying on this information. Mt Barker BP Roadhouse 9851 1222

If you need fuel after 10pm, you may need to go to Albany to refuel at one of the 24 hour stations. From there go out the South Coast Highway (Albany-Jerramungup Road) to Manypeaks, and continue as above.

<u>Track to the beach</u> is definitely 4 wheel drive only, and once you're on the track there are very few places to turn or get off the track and there are soft uphill sandy sections.

With the loads carried for a long weekend camping trip, you <u>must</u> let your tyres down to beach driving pressures <u>before starting on the track</u>. Suggest 20 psi or less but it's your responsibility to have pressures suitable for your vehicle, tyres and load, and use 4WD as there are some very soft uphill sections. The track gets badly chewed up by people who don't consider other people and leave their tyres at normal pressure or only let them down a little bit.

The track starts off easy across fairly flat country, but you'll come to a place where the track splits for a hundred metres or so and comes back together before going a bit right and up a hill. This is the start of a soft uphill section which goes on and up for quite a way and you don't want to get stuck on this.

The last uphill section is beach sand and sometimes covered by fresh sand drifts, dry and quite soft, with a steep bit at the top on a right hand curve. If you get stuck here it's a job to get moving again, and no one can get past you. It's easy with the right tyre pressures and keeping moving. After that you're into the sand dunes downhill and on to the beach.

Those of you who stayed for the "Reading the Beach" presentation at the February General meeting will have seen the aerial photos of the track, camping area etc.

According to Google maps, the track meets the beach at 34°48′03.71" South, 118°24′35.51" East. Travel east along the beach for about 4km till you reach the west side of the creek and the camp site. The creek meets the beach at 34°45′33.77" South, 118°26′29.11" East. If you have a GPS it might be worth checking and recording this to use when coming back to camp in the dark.

If you have time on the way back to Perth, the route through the Porongorups Ranges is a magnificent drive with great scenery. Allow a couple of extra hours to go this way.

AAAWA State Rock and Beach Fishing Championships

The 2009/10 State Rock and Beach Fishing Championships will be held at Jurien Bay on Saturday and Sunday 13/14 March 2010. Boundaries are from the Cervantes jetty to the Greenhead jetty including the jetties.

Briefing, weigh-in and presentations will be at Jurien Bay Tourist Caravan Park. Registration times from 11am to 12am, briefing at 12 noon on Saturday. Lines down at 1pm. Weigh in commences at 10am sharp on Sunday. All bags must be in weigh-in area by 10am. Presentations to commence after weigh-in (approximately 11am).

New Recreational Fishing from Boat Licence

A Recreational Fishing from Boat Licence (RFBL) will be required from 2 March, 2010 for any general fishing activity carried out with the use of a vessel with a motor.

Examples of where the new licence is required when fishing from a powered boat include line fishing (handline, rod and line, squid jigging); catching crabs; spearfishing; catching octopus; and dip-netting for prawns.

You will be required to have a licence where fish, crabs or shellfish are taken by line fishing, wading or other non-boat based activities, and when you have used a powered boat to reach your fishing location, eg crossing a river, but not when you have used a commercial boat service to reach an Island like Rottnest.

A licence costs \$30 per year with 50% reduction for pensioners, senior card holders and under 16s.

How to tie a dropper loop knot









Make a loop in the line. The overall circumference of the loop should be about 50mm longer than you want for the final length of the dropper loop.

Place a match (or similar) where the line crosses over in the loop.

Use your fingers and thumbs and the match to twist the crossover part of the loop around itself.

The hardest part is keeping the loop together until the first turn is made. After that it is easy.

Starting with the head of the match pointing away from you as shown above, rotate the match and the line so the head of the match now points towards you. That is the first half a turn.

Continue rotating the match and line so the match head is pointing away again. That's one full turn.

Use about 6 to 8 full turns when tying this knot in nylon line. As with all knots, more turns are needed for light line, and heavy line can use fewer turns.

Feed the end of the loop through the opening where the match is.

Remove the match, wet the line and all the knot very well and pull the knot up slowly and evenly until it is tight.

All the turns should end up neatly against each other along the main line, and the loop should stand out at right angles to the main line.

You can cut one end of the loop close to the knot so there is only a single line to the hook. If you intend to do this, then use more loops in the knot and leave a short stub of line in case the knot still has a bit of slippage left in it.


The knot in these photos is made with a heavy shoelace for clarity in the photos and has only about 2½ turns.

Double whitebait or bluebait rig

Ideal for fishing for herring or skippy at Bluff Creek. Uses the dropper loop knot described in the other article. Can be cast a country mile with a reasonable sized sinker even in windy conditions.

I suggest use about 8 to 10kg trace line for this rig if you intend to use it with larger sinkers. All the stress of casting is on those 2 dropper loop knots, and don't forget Salmon love whitebait, so a rig made with light line may let you down if you get a good fish.





Combination mulie and whitebait rig

This is a basic running sinker rig for a mulie and a whitebait or bluebait. Use it from the beach, or from the rocks or reef in reasonably clear water. Add a cork near the hooks to keep the bait off the bottom if crabs are a problem.

The gang of Limerick or Tarpon size 6 to 2 hooks on a short trace and snap connector, with a whitebait or bluebait is for small fish like herring, skippy, tarwhine, etc. but many good sized fish have been caught on these smaller baits, so make sure the trace is reasonably strong and take it easy if you hook a bigger fish like a Salmon, which love whitebait.

The trace lengths should be chosen with the sinker section much longer than the bottom hook section, as shown, so that the two gangs of hooks cannot tangle with each other.

Camping stove safety

With the summer break in full swing, EnergySafety would like remind all consumers of the possible hazards associated with the small butane gas camping stoves. They have become very popular for camping because of their convenience and general ease of operation.

Every year, about this time, EnergySafety receives reports of incidents where these camping stoves have exploded and/or caught fire. To date there have been no reported major injuries from these incidents other than superficial burns.



A typical portable camping stove

When changing the butane cylinder, make sure it is done away from naked flames, open fires, camping lanterns etc.

The stove is always to be used in a well ventilated area. If a portable camping stove becomes damaged in any way it should be discarded.

These stoves are inexpensive and it is safer to replace it with a new one. When purchasing a camping stove, persons should look for the Australian Gas Association (AGA) approval.

Incidents in all cases have been attributed to misuse of the stove, incorrect assembly of the trivet (pan support) and not understanding the instructions for changing the butane gas cylinder.

These camping stoves come complete in a plastic blow formed carry case. It is important to understand the instructions, and that the trivet must be assembled correctly.

In transit, the trivet is inverted to fit inside the carry case. It must be reassembled correctly for safe operation.

Field day fishing times

The Committee has passed a motion that fishing times on normal weekend field days (not long weekends) will be from 12 noon Saturday to 12 noon Sunday or earlier (eg 10am) on Sunday during summer months with early sunrise and hot weather.

The Committee recognises that people who go to the trouble and expense of travelling for Field Days have a reasonable expectation that they will get the best possible opportunities to fish.

There are two quite separate things to consider:-

- 1. The enjoyment and catch of fish the person gets from fishing in the location, and
- 2. The amount of fishing time and fish which are eligible for the Field Day competition.

The Committee also recognises that some members cannot travel to some of the "away" Field Days because of work or family commitments or cost, so the Club has a "Local" Field Day at which members can fish in the Metro area at any times they have available.

The Club has always had competition fishing times of about 22 to 24 consecutive hours as above on normal 2 day weekends. Fishing before or after those times is at the discretion of the member if he is able to.

Greatly extended fishing times for the Field Day on normal weekends put people who can only attend the Local Field Day at a further disadvantage.

Department of Fisheries rules specify daily bag limits which people may keep. When people fish on 2 or more days, they are allowed to keep up to 2 days' bag limit of whole fish.

However the club allows only 1 day's bag limit of fish to be weighed in for any species, regardless of how long the Field Day is, for example even when people have the opportunity to fish on the 3 separate calendar days of a long weekend.

There is already a significant difference between what a person can legally keep, and what a Club member can weigh in. But this "only 1 day's bag limit of fish for weigh in" does not restrict in any way what people can catch or the enjoyment they get from fishing and catching fish and keeping fish within the rules and limits set by Fisheries.

Similarly the above fishing times during which catches will be eligible for weigh in does not restrict in any way what people can catch or the enjoyment they get from fishing and catching fish and keeping fish.

The Club has always allowed people to fish before any official start time for a Field Day and fish after any stop or weigh in time for the Field Day. An honour system applies that fish caught outside the specified Field Day times are not eligible for weighing in for the Field Day competition.

This is considerably more lenient than some other clubs and AAAWA State Championship events which still list disqualification for fishing before the nominated "lines down" time.

Even on long weekends when some people can travel a day earlier and may want to fish early on Saturday morning, the start times are usually still around noon.

Fish caught while people are at the place the Field day is held, but outside the Field Day times, are eligible for the Club's Open Fishing Competition, which really does need more entries.

The listed fishing times will not restrict the enjoyment and benefit people get for the expense and time of travelling to the Field Day venue. It will only affect which fish are eligible for weigh in, which are already affected and restricted by Dept of Fisheries rules.
