A.A.A. - STATE DRYCASTING TITLES (91/92 YEAR)

YOKINE RESERVE - Sunday 30th August 1992

After cancellation in June due to winter storms, the competition was held on 30th August 1992 under gusty winds and at times heavy showers.

Due to these conditions and the inevitable delays caused by the adverse conditions, one event was dropped. ie The Artificial Bait Distance held for the teams event also doubled as the individual cast.

Seven (7) clubs participated with a total of 58 casters.

It is to be noted that a total of 11 of the 20 State Drycasting Records were broken. In part this can be attributed to variable conditions where at times some casters benefited from gusty tail winds.

Many thanks must go to the helpers (on the day as well as beforehand, setting up the courts etc). A large number of people were involved in running the event. Particular thanks to Leigh and Nella Clifton from Surfcasters for the use of their Camper Trailer, and to the Surfcasters for the use of their casting equipment which allows three (3) lanes to be utilised.

EXPENSES: with the numbers being down due to the initial cancellation a slight loss was incurred. If the cast had gone ahead in June as originally planned, the 72 casters would have enabled a profit to be realised.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

(1) ONE DAY EVENT: the one day event is considered generally by all casters as preferable to the two day type of event. The option of having the Artificial Bait event count for both the teams and individual events can be utilised when time is insufficient.

(2) TEAM COMPOSITION: as clubs are experiencing problems obtaining full teams, the suggestion is that the following teams structure be examined in the coming year as a means of encouraging greater team and caster participation by reducing the number of casters needed to assemble full teams:

MENS team: 4 competitors, plus 1 reserve
(rather than the present 6 plus 2)

LADIES, VETERANS, JUNIORS & MINI-JUNIORS teams:
2 competitors, plus 1 reserve
(rather than the present 3 plus 1)

(3) NUMBER OF TEAMS: clubs to be allowed to enter more than one team when they have sufficient numbers to do so.

(4) EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURE: while some minor expenditures on equipment were made (eg. batteries, rope, trailer lights), other items to be considered for the next competition include:

- new 6.25 m tapes (4) for accuracy events (mandatory)
- new 120/150 m tape (1) (optional)
- repaint trailer (within next couple of years)
