Recfishwest Annual General Meeting and Election of Board Members

The Recfishwest Annual General Meeting and election of some Board members will be held at 7.30 pm on Friday 27 October, in the Bridge Room, Fremantle Sailing Club, "Success Harbour" Marine Terrace Fremantle

Elections will be to fill three Public Board Member positions on the Recfishwest Board.

Following Constitutional amendments approved at a Special General Meeting held on 5 July 2006, nominations will also be called for one Public Board Member who may be a member of a fishing club (or fishing association). Previously, members of fishing clubs and associations were not eligible to be RFW Public Board members.

The Annual General Meeting also provides the opportunity for Recfishwest members to discuss recreational fisheries management questions and have some refreshments at the end of the formal part.

Cervantes Field Day September 2006

It's 6.00am on Saturday morning and I awake to Iain Cameron's "Hallelujah". As I don't normally set the alarm on a Saturday, this can only mean one thing – Cervantes. No time for a cup of tea in bed or romance; it's straight out of bed and get stuck into breakfast. As I am eating, Marcia is packing the food Esky with all the meals she has prepared the day before: meat loaf, tuna pie, quiche, fruit cake – enough food to feed an army for a week! Having collected Andrew and Stephen we are on the road by 8.00am. Their brother, Philip, had work commitments and was unable to attend.

As it was a rather uneventful trip (thank God) we were able to cruise into Cervantes by 11.00am and were greeted by Morris Kolman, John Crompton, Mark Hansen, Greg Walker, Peter Osborne, Mal Harris & Vix Alexander at our pre-arranged sign on. At this point, George was on a reconnaissance mission checking out conditions and access to fishing spots for the benefit of all, especially those of us restricted to 2WD vehicles. Mark Hansen confidently said "just follow us and if you get bogged [which we did a number of times] we will just pull you out." Once Greg armed us with a UHF radio so we could communicate with fellow surf casters, we were complete.

Having never fished Cervantes before, I must say I was really disappointed when we looked across the ocean: no waves, no foam, no gutters, no rips. It was just flat with some weed visible. Great – having just driven 250km to be greeted by this, I said to Andrew "we won't be catching much here". Having overheard this, George said "Don't worry, this isn't a typical surf beach, this is Cervantes." So with little enthusiasm we started setting up camp, the boys on tent and annex duties, me on rods and reels. What followed was lunch and a cuppa. After some more thought and surveillance, Andrew said "Come on, Dad, let's give it a go". So we walked all of 50m down to the beach with our rods, baited up and started fishing. On my first cast, I was jolted into action by a good bite, but it produced nothing. Andrew's second cast netted a herring, followed by a good hit on his third cast (probably a tailor). At this point, it seemed apparent that the fish were already biting. Every second or third cast we caught something, either herring, tailor or butterfish and the occasional skippy and flathead. To my way of thinking, this isn't a bad start given that it's 2 o'clock in the afternoon and we're fishing on a falling tide. Whatever we used, mulies, white bait or sardines, they all seemed to attract bites. So with our bag starting to fill up, we put Stevie, the expert fish cleaner, to work. Seriously, Stevie reckons the best part of fishing is cleaning the fish. So armed with my favourite knife and dressed in only his boxer shorts, away he went.

As with all good fishing trips, darkness was soon upon us. We were hungry so it was time to retreat to our camp. We are new to camping, and we soon realized we had forgotten a lighter for the stove. Greg came to our rescue with a spare lighter and we were grateful to be camping close to people who come prepared, with two of nearly everything.

After tea, as we were all set up within a few hundred metres of each other, we grabbed Mark to come with us to check out how the others had fared. After a social chat, the boys and I headed back to our tent, leaving Mark with George and they apparently polished off a bottle of red, which led to their late start the next day.

After a good night's sleep and a cup of coffee, Andrew and I were back on the beach early to find fish biting as we left them. Eventually Stevie joined us to fish; three casts produced three herring and that was enough for him.

Our camping spot was on the road out and as we were packing up some members dropped by and joined us for a cuppa and chat about the weekend's fishing. Because we had all been fishing close together, it was just common sense to have the weigh in at the close by car park instead of driving back to town. Plus, I needed my tyres pumped up for highway driving, and at this point George stepped in to sort it out.

The weigh in produced a variety of fish from all anglers, with Peter Osborne's bag of tailor proving hard to beat followed by Andrew Pekaar's mixed bag. Another good chat and photo shoot in the car park before the drive home put a nice finishing touch on the weekend.

I would like to reiterate my thanks to everyone present as they all helped to make our first club field day a memorable one.

September Dry Casting Report 2006

The Sunday cast saw an attendance of 20 casters present and we welcomed new members along in Tino Baiardo, and Peter Pekaar and his two sons, Andrew and Stephen.

Weather conditions were a bit ordinary as was reflected in the number of casts which went out of court on the day. The wind was a strong northerly side wind, gusty and somewhat cool, but the weather was fine.

It was interesting to watch the achievements of the new casters which means they have a mark to improve on. Peter Pekaar cast 105 metres in the 56 gram event and his longest in the 112 gram distance was 126 metres, a very good effort considering the longest cast of the day was 157 metres by George Holman. Tino Baiardo's best was 96 metres so he needs to attend casting a few more times!! Young Andrew Pekaar's best was 105 metres, but was a metre short of last month's cast of 106 metres. Stephen Pekaar cast 67 metres for his first casting day. Worthy of mention, Peter Pekaar joined the bull's eye brigade with a direct hit in the single-hand accuracy along with Allan Jones. Quiet achiever, Geoff Raftis, managed a bull in the double-handed accuracy. Wendy Hansen had a torrid day with the windy conditions but she was not the only one.

George Holman had the longest 56 gram cast of 138 metres, but Malcolm Harris cast 128 and 134 metres, and veteran Bob Henderson 128 and 126 metres.

George again had the longest cast in the artificial bait event with a cast of 136 metres followed by Bob Henderson 121 and Garry Gildersleeves 117 metres. George continued a good day with longest in 112 gram distance 157 metres and other good scores were Mal Harris 144 and 154, Bob Henderson 144 and 147 and Garry Gildersleeves 144 and 135. That crafty veteran Malcolm Head showed us how it was done in the DH Accuracy with 153 points, followed by George with 147, Terry Fuller 128 and Geoff Raftis 119. We won't say any more about the rest!!!

George finished off a good day with 34 out of the possible 40 in the SH Accuracy and other good scores were Mark Hansen 26 and Malcolm Harris 25.
