MARCH GENERAL MEETING:

The March meeting was chaired by our President, George Holman, who received and accepted a motion for the suspension of standing orders directly after the Secretary's and Treasurer's reports.

Our guest speaker, Mr. George Stacey from the R.L.S. was introduced.

Mr. Stacey gave a very fine lecture on mouth to mouth resuscitation or 'The Expired Air Method' as he called it. It was one of the most enjoyable lectures I've seen on the subject. He had most of us in fits of laughter most of the time and yet he got his message over very well. I think even Bert Payne might have picked up a few tips on how to spin a yarn!!

The lecture took up a fair amount of time and it was agreed we would miss fishing reports and proceed with general business.

The meeting was given a report by the Treasurer, Dennis Green, on a Committee decision to purchase a block of land together with a transportable house on it at Kalbarri.

The cost of the house and land is \$10,500. It is proposed to put a deposit of approximately \$4,500 down and raise a loan through the National Bank for the balance. Five club members have volunteered to stand as guarantors for the loan.

The house is rented out at \$40 per week and at \$35 for club members. Bookings, deposits etc. will be handled by a caretaker, resident in Kalbarri, who is to be appointed by the Committee.

A Non Interest bearing debenture will be issued in the near future and we look forward to the club members generous support. With the income from the house rent, together with the Debenture issue, we expect to be able to own the property in five years, and then have a healthy, regular income into our building fund.

The matter was discussed at some length and the motion that the committees action be endorsed was carried unanimously.

Due to the lateness of the hour the meeting was then adjourned.

FIELD DAY REPORT: KALBARRI:

A.F.D.O. would like to apologise for his lateness to the field day sign on at Kalbarri and would like to thank all the members in attendance for letting their presence be known as it was one of those situations where no-one knew who was where and indeed, if anyone was there at all.

Many of the regular faces were absent from this field day for obvious reasons (Cyclone Wally), but it was still a fairly reasonable number that eventually signed on (19 members, 1 visitor).

A.F.D.O. and party arrived at Kalbarri at about 4 o'clock on Saturday, and after a quick look around, it seemed as though Brian Rowland, Trevor Stam, John Reeley and A.F.D.O., were the only ones who had bothered to attend, however, after pitching camp, we grabbed some fishing gear and headed for the nearest water.

MARCH CAST:

On an eventful casting day, A.D.C.O. arrived at 8.10 a.m., to find D.C.O. waiting for the caretaker to open the gates to Floreat Oval. At 8.40 with about 20 blokes standing around, the caretaker still had not arrived, thus it was that A.D.C.O. was duly elected to stir up the caretaker. After being told that the caretaker was on "hols" (isn't he always) A.D.C.O. procured the key and returned at a cautious speed to the oval to open the gate a fraction before 9 a.m. It was therefore not surprising that the cast started late.

With an attendance of 30 (our ranks were swelled by the inclusion of 5 F.A.C. members), it required clever and skilful manipulation to have our fellows off the oval by 12 noon. Our punctual termination of the cast was assured when we were told that the local council had booked a cricket club to start play at 10 o'clock, consequently a few warnings were given to people encroaching on the arena whilst casting was in progress.

A feature of the single hander was the distance between caster and target. If the discs had been any further away, they could have been used in the double-hander and as one could imagine, the only way to reach them was to achieve a run up Dennis Lillee fashion, thereby imparting added inertia, or by having had previous experience with a bull whip. In connection with this, Gentleman Jimmy Strong was heard to say, that in 20 years of dry casting it was the first occasion on which he had not scored a single point for the accuracy events.

The Fremantle chaps who attended- Dudley Ludgrove, Bill Johnson, Club Pres., Ted Hayman, Tom Fardig and his nephew Alan Cooper, besides being very sociable ambassadors for their club, performed with admirable skill in all events except the single hander (apparently they do not have much in their own drycasting), however they were not alone in that event.

Since things were a bit hectic, the only other points of interest which didn't go unheeded were the scores:-

In the L/I Distance, first three placegetters were E. Parker 41 pts, (good effort Tiny), H. Hew and J. Devitt (longtime no see) both with 40.

Double Handed Accuracy- standing head and shoulders above the rest was D. (Ike) Green with 47, next was Mr. Pres., G. Holman with 34 and the cast finishing T. Richardson with 31- incidentally Tony's wife had a baby the night before- Tony finished in 7th spot for the day; congratulations on both counts Tony.

In the Single Handed Accuracy only Hewie scored with consistency for 26 with G. Baskerville 19 and R. Lerch Jnr 15.

The Longest Cast for the day was a magnificent 143 metres by our nonchalant and modest social organiser, B. Leicester (ask him how he did it).

At least, or should I say at least, attendance improved, even without the Free blokes we had 25- keep it up.

By-Laws

Clause 1 Membership

Subclause 5

Persons who have been nominated as ordinary members and who have complied with the requirements of sub clause (3) above, may, pending the decision of the committee, enjoy the privileges of an ordinary member without the power to vote.

Sub-clause 6

In the event of a candidate being rejected the money paid by him shall be refunded and he shall not be eligible to stand for membership again within a period of three months.
