The W.A. Sports Federation delegate, Paul Foster, reported that the assistance to the Australian Championships W.A. team for next year is as it was previously indicated: dollar for dollar subsidy for only the top competitor in each division.

The Sportsman of the Year Nominations are to be in to the A.A.A. by the September meeting, the period of consideration to be from 1/9/77 to 31/8/78 this year. We need nominations for the top senior angler and the top junior - the latter to be under 19 in the year of 1/9/77-31/8/78. It was reported that F.D.T. may be doing a piece on the "Off Road Bill" in the near future.

The Estuary event next year will be held in the Murray River region.

The recommendation of the bag limit of five salmon per day per angler was passed, the recommendation now to be passed on to Fisheries Department.

It appears the boat ramps at Cockburn Sound are in danger of being moved due to the mooted ship building industry to be constructed there.

Mr. President, Members:

I submit, for your approval, the attached financial statements for the year ended April 30, 1978.

The year has been a successful one, financially, for our Club. Our overall surplus of Income over Expenditure was \$1196, and this was made up from the following:

(1)	Income from General Activities	\$ 271
(2)	Income from Kalbarri Property	779
(3)	Income from Building Fund	146

This surplus compares most favourably with the amount of \$1096 achieved last year.

The year's surplus of \$1196 does not take into account the repayment of \$1200 for the Kalbarri Property housing loan, or \$256 the Club had to outlay for a Gestetner Duplicator and various small capital items.

The Club has three years and three months to pay the balance of the \$3900 housing loan, and it is important that, for the next three years, the Club continues to take positive actions to ensure that we generate sufficient funds to enable the Club to pay off the balance. The amount of \$1200 per annum should not be a major burden on the Club, as income from the Kalbarri Property, if properly managed, will continue to contribute a major portion of the revenue necessary for the loan repayment.

GENERAL FUND

A surplus of \$1050 was achieved, as against the previous year's total of \$709. The surplus was generated mainly through income from the Kalbarri Property. This showed an income of \$779, as against a deficit of \$329 in 1976/77. This outstanding performance was offset by a reduction in income from General Activities, as can be seen below:

SUBSCRIPTION

Membership subscription for senior members remained the same as was levied last year. A Family Membership subscription of \$30 was introduced, and subscription for juniors was reduced from \$8 to \$1, to encourage parents to bring their children to the Club.

The total subscription of \$1487 for the year, compares favourable with \$1466 for the previous year.

SOCIAL

Social activities for the year were again conducted profitably. The year's surplus was \$287, as against \$404 in 1976/77 and \$15 in 1975/76.

Full details of social activities are outlined under Note 3, page 2, of the attached accounts.

REEL TALK

Costs to produce the monthly Reel Talk totalled \$600, plus \$127 for postage. This compares with \$476 in 1976/77 plus \$123 for postage.

The increase of \$128 was attributed to bulk purchase of covers and wrappers, and to late receipt of advertising in Reel Talk.

DRY CASTING

Costs of Dry Casting increased by \$55. This was mainly due to cost of hire of the Floreat Oval, which has increased very substantially during the year.

CLUB BADGES

It was necessary to purchase 100 Club Badges, to replenish stock that ran out during the year. The expense of \$207 should see us through for a couple of seasons.

TROPHIES

Trophy donors once again continued their support in 1977/78. Our special thanks must also go to our President, Mr. George Holman, for approaching the various fishing tackle shops and distributors for donations.

The total net expenditure of \$85 for trophies, was a splendid result, considering the quality of the trophies presented. Conservatively, the total value of all the trophies presented at the Annual Dinner must be in excess of \$800.

BUILDING FUND

Building Fund income totalled \$146, and the balance of the account at the bank was \$1286.

It is estimated that, in 1978/79, about \$300 will be required for capital improvement of the Kalbarri Property, and that the account will have a surplus of \$900. It is recommended that \$800 of this balance be invested with the Perth Building Society, on Fixed Term Deposits, to generate extra interest.

NOTE 2 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING PRACTICE

- 2.1 Accounts have been prepared using Historical Cost method of accounting.
- 2.2 Purchase of covers and wrappers for "Reel Talk", club badges, insurance, rates and other annual expenses are written off in total in the year of payment and are not apportioned.
- 2.3 The Kalbarri property is recorded at cost and no provision for depreciation of the building has been brought to account in arriving at the financial result for the year. The Management Committee considers the property would have been, at the 30th April, 1978, and would now be, capable of realising more than Balance Sheet value.
- 2.4 All Current Assets are expected to realise Balance Sheet values in the normal course of Club operations and no provision for Doubtful Debts is considered necessary.
- 2.5 Depreciation of Plant and Equipment is calculated on the Prime Cost method (i.e. on original cost or valuation) at 10% per annum.
