NOVEMBER GENERAL MEETING:

President George opened the meeting by welcoming GORDON TOMSIT to the club and presenting him with his badge.

George then proceeded with his Committee report.

The major business at the Committee Meeting was the gross misrepresentation of our Motion to the A.A.A. (ref. next years fixtures) in the Minutes circulated to affiliated clubs.

Our delegates reported that acceptance of minutes was rushed through at the A.A.A. meeting, and our protest about the wording of the minutes were not heeded.

We accept his resignation with regret but Andy assures us that any club member calling in for gear at William Street will get the best of service and prices. Thanks Andy!

A letter was received from Northampton Club appointing Eric Parker as their proxy to the A.A.A.

A very pleasant letter was received from the winner of the 2nd prize in the raffle thanking the club. A Mr. G. Hore of Leederville Tech. Col. sold by B. Leicester.

All other reports were given and most of them are printed elsewhere in this issue.

Special Business:

George Holman handed the Chair over to Vice President Roy Lundy and spoke from the floor of the meeting on a personal matter.

He asked members to seek to pull together for the good of the club and asked some questions on declining club membership.

Destructive criticism will only lose us members, constructive criticism will build a better club serving members interests more fully.

General Business:

There was no particular general business and the meeting heard a report from Bill Morrow on a new world record catch made by him on Salt Water Fly. (See separate report).

The meeting developed into a discussion on instruction periods with some very good suggestions coming forward.

Basil Marsh reported on sheeting a foam bait box with Fabric & 'Bandcrete' and Don Bibby reported success with a similar project using unbleached calico. The sample Basil had brought along looked real good!

NOVEMBER GENERAL MEETING CONT'D:

Open Casting Championships: A report made by Jim Strong who congratulated George Holman on a fine win under difficult windy conditions. Members remarked afterwards of no notice of event was given.

A.A.A. claim they were sent but it appears we did not receive on time and I understand that we were not the only club to miss out.

Roy Lundy explained the date published was the wrong date and to compensate for the error, entries were received up to the start of the event to allow latecomers to enter.

INSTRUCTION PERIOD:

Jack Harvey spoke on fishing generally and in particular the effects of noise on beach fishing. He explained how he noticed on holiday that the week before the school holidays when the beaches were deserted he caught fish. During the holidays with more traffic on the beaches, bikes, etc., - no fish.

He cited Preston Beach Championship. Vehicles on the beach patrolling all night- poor catches. This matter was discussed with Rolly McKay and Rolly agreed that fish are sensitive to vibrations, particularly whiting and mullock.

Alf Rutland pointed out the consistent catches recorded at Garden Island over the years- no traffic; likewise Rottnest.

Basil Marsh noted that at Cervantes recently fish went off the bite when bikes came onto the beach.

I wonder- could our 4 W.D. on the beach, getting to that "good spot", be defeating the whole idea by driving the fish into deeper water?

 Congratulations Bill, a fine effort, and I suspect, not as simple as you would have us believe!

NOVEMBER CAST:

With fine weather in the metro area all week, it was no surprise to find our casting day threatened with rain- however, the clouds cleared a little later and the 19 seniors and 1 junior were treated with conditions more to their liking.
