NOVEMBER DRYCASTING REPORT:

Sunday, 4th November saw 34 casters attend in a friendly atmosphere which impressed our 3 visitors from Northern Districts Angling Club. Ron Thomas, Richard Williams and AAA D/C Officer, Peter Wise, accredited themselves with some fine casting but were let down on overall points by not being used to casting in a single handed event. Ron is our current State Champion and needed the practice to sharpen his casting up which he will need to do to take off the title again this year.

Gary & George are running "hot" at the right time to be pre-post favourites for the title. Evidenced by this was Gary's excellent 139 points to top the day followed by George with 133 points. (These two lads are the top casters to date for the 79/80 season). On form Ric Parker in third spot with 117 points.

Level Line saw Ric pip Hewie for the first time this season for top honours of 42 points, Hewie second and Stan Renshaw 40 points.

Gary 52 points and George 56 points showed the way in D/H Accuracy, Gary again 32 points in S/H accuracy, 29 for Killer, George 28 points.

Longest Cast went to Ric with 144 metres, into a wind. Mind you he has a lot of wind behind him. Clayton Freind topped the Juniors with 96 points and for your information has cast all this season from the seniors mark. We don't "handicap" a top boy like him.

Open D/H Distance saw visitor Ron Thomas cast 152 metres, Hewie 151 and George 145. Gary won the Novelty Cast of a box of lures donated by Rudy Lerch. Event was closest to target at 70 metres and Gary was about 12 inches away. Well done Gary and thanks to Rudy.

You will notice the top placings for the year to date have changed considerably from last month. As you know the final result of the years cast is made up of the 11 best casts out of 12. Therefore, the lowest cast is dropped or a caster may have missed a cast day which means he drops that day as his lowest. These figures, together with future casts, will be how I will list them for the balance of the season.

Our next casting day is December 2nd. Usual events plus S/H Open. Can George break 100 metres for the first time??? Or, will Dave beat him to it???

We have invited 6 casters from Fremantle A/C to join us on the day. Come down and give them a warm welcome won't you.
