Many thanks to Bruce, and to Iris (his long suffering wife) for all the help, and paticularly thanks to Iris for that lovely


The chances of going back to Esperance next year are pretty good. Surely we won't be unlucky enough to cop bad weather two years in a row!

- 1. ESTUAF CHAMPIONSHIPS: Swan River November 2ath/27th 1988.
- 2. MANDURAH 500: January 14th/15th 1989.
 - Stories from clubs are required for publication in Western Angler.
 e.g. Fish tales, homourous stories, photos etc.
