Because of Marcia and Peter's involvement we have built up a very special relationship which I have cherished.

Marcia's involvement with both Club and Association enabled her to make many, many friends and her advice and help was always appreciated. Marcia could be blunt sometimes but everything she said and did was positive and well meaning, and as a result she was well known and received wherever she went, both here and interstate.

From a club perspective, she represented our Club in many State and interstate events, did time on many committees and helped a lot of club members and committee people personally which was one of her special attributes. Her social involvement was special. Our club is mourning her loss.

Marcia, Peter and I travelled interstate on a number of occasions representing the State Association at meetings and events and as a result she was known Australia wide and made many friends who appreciated her company and involvement. Even to the end she made the effort to be involved and attended the State Dry Casting at the end of last month to say hello to us all and to be present when husband Peter was presented with the championship trophy. Peter was wearing Marcia's T-shirt. That shows the calibre of the person Marcia was.

Personally some of the special moments in my life were when I was with Marcia and Peter on those trips away or in Marcia's company.

I, along with all of her friends, miss her. Farewell Marcia.

Marcia and Peter Pekaar applied to join the Club in April 2006, and were welcomed as members in June 2006. Just a short time later at the July 2006 General Meeting, Marcia stepped up to fill a Committee vacancy in a critical role in the Club.

Marcia lived the principle "If it is worth having, it is worth working for" and was always ready to pitch in and help wherever and whenever she could.

She served on Committee as Reel Talk Editor in 2006/7, 2007/8 and 2008/9 up to March 2009, and Vice President from December 2008 to March 2009 inclusive, and a Committee member from December 2009 to August 2010.

She loved her job of Reel Talk Editor, and only gave it up with reluctance and regret during a time of great instability in the management of the Club, which put unfair pressure on her and some other Committee members.

Marcia was a wiz with a keyboard and computer word processor, and was an editor of the very highest calibre. She was always willing to use her skills and time to write up and print notes, minutes and other documents to help other Club and Association people. She would also proof read their documents, a very valuable service to avoid mistakes and produce professional quality work.

"Mrs. Eagle Eyes" was the well deserved nickname I gave her when she found many little and some not so little changes needed in the wording and layout of drafts of Reel Talks and various reports.

Marcia and Peter have worked hard in both the upfront and the "behind the scenes" work for Club dry casting, helping several Dry Casting Officers over the time they have been in the Club. Printing the blank score sheets, collecting the fees and passing them to the Treasurer, setting the order of casting, operating the laser measure, transferring the hand written scores into an electronic format, emailing these to me, checking the results produced by the computer scoring system, and writing reports for Reel Talk, they have done so much.

Marcia and Peter have written many entertaining articles on Club and Association activities for Reel Talks while they have been members.

Marcia loved flowers and I was able to give her many buckets full of beautiful roses from my garden over the years and recently, getting the nickname "Mr Roses" from her.

Marcia and Peter attended the AAA National Convention and Championships at South West Rocks in NSW in August 2011. She felt unwell while away and went to the doctor when she returned to Perth. Devastating news. She was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, one of the nastiest types.

Marcia handled all this illness could throw at her with bravery and courage, and kept doing things as normal as much as she was able to.

Marcia passed away peacefully on the night of Tuesday 13 November with family members nearby.

Her funeral was held at Pinnaroo on Tuesday 20 November. About 150 people attended, including many members and wives from Surfcasters, the Australian Anglers Association and other clubs, work colleagues, family and friends.

I was privileged to be asked to read one of the readings. Thank you, Peter.

Rest in peace, Marcia. I will miss you.

<u>Kalbarri bathroom upgrade</u> Allocation of funds for work to upgrade the bathroom was approved by members at the August General meeting. A deposit of \$5,200 has been paid after being approved at the October Committee meeting. The balance will need to be paid on completion after approval by the Club's Property Officer. This will probably be before the next General meeting and if so will be authorised by Committee.

<u>Grant for equipment</u> The Club has received an offer of a Community Volunteer Grant of \$2,000 from the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA) in response to the application I put in during July.

Items listed in the application for the grant and to be bought soon are:-

Digital camera \$500, Projector (as used at Club Instruction periods) \$700, External hard drive \$100, A3 printer/scanner \$350, Portable Loud hailer \$150, A3 laminator \$200, plus some accessories and consumables. More details were published in page 24 of the August 2012 Reel Talk.

I will buy the items, some locally and some on line, and mostly from Australian stores. I have already checked the availability and costs for some items. Choice of major items will be advised to Committee by email or telephone before purchase.

The grant of \$2,000 will be separately accounted for as it is spent, with details reported in the monthly Treasurer's report and minutes in Reel Talk, and eventually reported back to the Department (FaHCSIA).

Normally I spend my own money and get reimbursed at the following meeting. However since this is a significant amount of money, can members please approve an advance of the \$2,000 to me, to be paid after the grant is directly deposited into the Club's bank account.

Moved Peter Osborne, seconded Mark Hansen that up to \$2,000 be advanced to T Fuller when funds are received, carried.

Moved John Crompton, seconded Ray Walker the November Treasurer's report be accepted and accounts be passed for payment, carried.

<u>Field Days</u> Peter Osborne reported briefly on the October field day and the coming Field day at Cervantes. George Holman is still suffering from the after effects of the stab from a stingray's spike.

<u>Dry Casting Officer</u> Ron Thomas reported on the November casting. Peter Pekaar cast two Club and two pending State records.

Property Officer Ray Walker said there were still vacancies in December and summer school holidays. The chest freezer has failed and a replacement has been bought. Work has commenced on the bathroom. Ray and Allan Jones will go to Kalbarri to inspect the work and deliver the freezer. Geoff Raftis has donated an electric barbecue. Some progress on getting the title deed for the Kalbarri property. The framed Club's Certificate of Incorporation is an important document. 



Field Day report Cervantes November 2012

Synopsis. The November 2012 field day was spread from Jurien to Cervantes with the majority of persons fishing the Hill river area, and the South Point near Jurien Township. While strong winds and weed everywhere, good catches resulted from these locations. No one fished locally. In summary, it was a repeat of the previous months for the field day at Cervantes, as again this venue resulted in catches of tailor plus miscellaneous fish resulting in lots of smiles at the weigh-in.

The trip. The sign on at the Hill River car park was at 1 pm Saturday 15 November with lines down at 2 pm with fishing through until through Sunday with the weigh-in at 11 am at the same car park. A total of 16 anglers signed on. George Holman, Pat McKeown, Martin Wearmouth and two sons Thomas and Christian, Shane Wignell and daughters Sarah and Emma, Victor and Slavka Schilo, John Crompton, Justin Rose, Jeff Hewton, Eddie and Debbie Korin and Peter Osborne.

Pat, John, Jeff and George Holman tried the sandy point just south of the Jurien township. All was quiet during the afternoon but as dusk arrived, the tailor turned up. George did hook rays and one thought to be a very big ray or a shark that headed to South Africa and with line on his spool rapidly disappearing he increased pressure and the fish let go. Terminal gear pulled out with bait OK but flattened, so the hooks did not penetrate. George did manage to avoid stingray tails this time so he did not have to call on Pat to do the safety officer bit.

This group also caught fish the following morning at the same place, with George also getting herring, a flathead and pike. Congratulations go to John for a first ever bag of 8 tailor, and with the Sunday morning fish, he came close to the two day bag limit with his 13 tailor.

Jeff also had a good bag of 8 tailor of 5.4 kg with his best tailor at 1.16 kg gilled and gutted.

Victor and Slavka and Eddie and Debbie fished south of Hill River car park. As we all had encountered they also had frustrating fishing due to high winds (SW to S) and weed right through our fishing period, but as the afternoon started to disappear they started to catch fish.

Victor got a couple of tailor plus a dart, some herring and pike, while Slavka landed a similar bag. While you both caught the same number of fish the statistics give Victor as having an additional species, he managed more points than Slavka, but Slavka had a heavier tailor of 0.72 kg, compared to Victor's at 0.69kg.

With similar catches Eddie had some tailor and Debbie had tailor plus a herring. Debbie had the higher points count, but Eddie had the slightly heavier tailor at 0.68 kg compared to Debbie's 0.59kg. Victor pointed out that where they were fishing a shark came swimming along the foreshore in just inches of water, so no place for swimming.

The rest of us (Shane Wignell and his two daughters, Martin and his two young sons, Justin and I) went to the mouth of the Hill River. As were the others we were also plagued with wind and weed. While we did not have a major run of fish, during afternoon, evening and morning between us, tailor continually came in ones and twos.

Shane captured some tailor and a spotted mackerel. He managed to out-fish his daughters with Sarah getting 4 tailor and Emma getting 2.

Shane only just managed to capture the biggest tailor of the field day at 1.17kg, only 0.01kg heavier than Jeff's. However congratulations to Emma (on the left) with her first ever tailor.

At the northern end of the group at Hill River the Wearmouth family quietly started to fill their bag. Martin continues to show his fishing skills as he had a full bag of tailor plus a flathead and dart.

His two boys, mini-juniors, Thomas and Christian also managed to capture 3 tailor each. They took a good esky of fish home as Martin also got his two day bag limit of tailor over the two days.

Justin fished hard and achieved his bag limit of tailor, plus herring, pike and a shark. Both Justin and I put burley out. Justin had several losing battles with large stingrays, however his efforts paid off and he landed the 6.1kg shark. He fished until nearly midnight, catching several mulloway but all undersize. With this shark he had the heaviest bag for the weekend.

Fishing beside Justin, no battles with rays for me. First time in a long time fishing here that I have not hooked one of those monster eagle rays. Like Shane, late afternoon I managed a spotted mackerel that would have gone close to 2.0kg uncleaned.

Over the two days I had my two day bag of 16 tailor so was able to present my best 8 of these species to the weigh-in, plus some herring a flathead and a pike and that pleasant surprise of the mackerel. Despite trying for large fish, no rays hooked, one good point but what I was really looking for was one of those small sharks and a good mulloway.

Like Justin I landed a few of those undersize mulloway. We could not find any large ones mixed in with these little soapies.

As in the last field day a month ago at Cervantes, there were lots of smiles at the Sunday morning weigh-in. Everyone had a good feed of fish to take home. With an hour to undertake the weigh-in and blow up tires we all departed by noon. The changed time of 1 pm Saturday sign-on and a 2 pm lines down and weigh-in of 11 am on Sunday was a good period for the club fishing.

You might notice that club members are starting to wear the new SCAC yellow caps. If you had been there you would have noticed a ring-in.

The closure period for capture and keeping of demersal species in the entire West Coast region finishes midnight 15 December. If you are lucky enough to catch a pink snapper or other demersal species you are not allowed to keep it, and there are big fines. The seasonal spawning protection closure for Pink Snapper in Cockburn and Warnbro Sounds finishes midnight 31 January. The closed season for Blue Swimmer crabs in Cockburn Sound finishes midnight 14 December.

UHF channel guide

UHF channels are allocated for 40 Channel systems as listed below by law and/or convention and/or agreement. (See note about 40/80 channels)

It is strongly recommended that club members use channel 10 for our club activities. If this channel is congested on the day, members can then move to channel 18 or any of the "General use" channels.

UHF channels	Used for	Comments 40 Channel systems see notes
11	Initial call	To call or locate another station. After contact you must move to another channel.
9, 12 to 17, 19 to 21, 24 to 30, 39	Conversations General use	Used for conversations between stations
10	4WD users	Generally used by 4WD Clubs and groups
18	Caravaners and campers	Holiday makers and travelers when in convoy and in national parks
40	Highway communications	Mainly used by truck drivers and other regular highway users.
5	Emergency calling	Can only be used in an emergency
1 to 8, 31 to 38	Repeaters. Established by law	Should be avoided unless in an emergency. Used in Duplex Mode to widen the area of communication through a repeater station. Will occupy 2 channels when in use, eg 1 and 31; up to 8 and 38.
22 and 23	Data transmission	No voice transmissions allowed on these two channels

That article also covers the expansion from 40 to 80 channels and warns:

"Unfortunately, MOST (but not all) of the old 40 channel UHF CB radios are not upgradeable to include the new 80 channels, which means that to access 80 channels you will need to buy a new unit. There are a limited range of units that can be unlocked - meaning they can be converted from the 40 channel system to the 80 channel system, so do a check of your existing model first before assuming you'll need to buy a new one.

The good news is that the ACMA has given a six year phase-in period during which you can continue to keep using your current 25 kHz radio. Be aware, however that there will be good deals going on through until late 2012 with new units being sold by retailers that are not compatible with the 80 channels system. The AMCA has allowed retailers a grace period to allow them to sell off old stock."

Equipment from Volunteer Grant 2012

The Club has received an offer of a Community Volunteer Grant of \$2,000 from the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA) in response to the application I put in during July.

The items to be bought as listed below were discussed at the November Committee meeting. This equipment will be available to be used by committee people and club members for or during club activities.

- 1. Digital still camera. Good zoom range, with a viewfinder (essential for shooting outdoors in sunlight) and adjustable LCD screens, with ability to record High Definition video, and the ability to capture a sequence of still images at several frames per second for capturing and analysing members' casting actions for tuition, demonstration, coaching and development of the sport. Plus spare battery, camera case and extra memory, etc. Requested \$500. Choice: Nikon Coolpix P510. Reason: Continuous shooting: 120 frames per second (60 frames at about 1/125 sec or faster), or 60 fps (60 frames at about 1/60 sec or faster), Full High Definition video is at 30 frames per second.
- 2. Video projector. For displaying videos, training and tuition sessions, and instructions to club members, the public and potential members. Plus connecting cords, 240 volt power surge protector, etc. Requested \$700. The models I looked at before are now out of stock. Will need to research current stock, prices and suppliers.
- 3. Portable external hard drive. For storage and backup of photos and videos. Plus protective carry case. Requested \$100. Choice: Seagate 1TB USB 3.0 Expansion drive.
- 4. Multi function A3 printer and scanner capable of printing, scanning and copying A3 colour, double sided. For preparation of training aids, notices and other aids for volunteers. Plus ink cartridges, paper etc. Requested \$350. Choice: Brother MFC-J6510DW.
- 5. Loud hailer, for organising outdoor events and passing information to people on sports field. Requested \$150. Choice: 25 Watt Megaphone with siren and detachable microphone model GTC108.
- 6. Laminator A3/A4/A5 for preparing visual aids for training and informing members, volunteers and visitors, plus A3/A4/A5 laminating sheets. Requested \$200. Choice: GBC Heatseal H75 A3 Laminator.



Backups ain't backups, unless....

Unless you know what the backup is really doing, you are sure that everything you **expect** to be backed up is **actually** backed up, the backup has several versions of the backup files so you can **easily** see and choose which version of the file to restore, etc.

I'm talking of computer backups here, as one of our members found when all of his emails disappeared despite having and using a backup. How could that happen?

Well, there are several different sorts of backups in Windows computers.

System backup copies everything on the system C: drive (depending on settings), and a restore from this returns files to as they were when the backup was made, meaning you could lose all your work or new emails since that backup was done, and that may be several days or some weeks. As with all backups, how often you do them affects the usefulness.

System restore copies the **state** of the Windows installation and installed programs but does not copy your data, documents, photos, emails, etc.

Backups done by software which comes "free" with external hard drives, etc. These do whatever they do, but **beware**, these are sometimes minimal versions with reduced options and limited control over what it does and what you can do to recover old files. If you want better control, sometimes you have to pay to get an upgraded version with more options.

The dangers of these are that some monitor file changes on your computer and keep the versions on the external drive the same as on the computer, and so automatically copy the latest version on to the external hard drive. If the version on your computer is corrupted or some content is accidentally deleted, then a copy of that is made to the hard drive. Disaster! Because if you try to restore, that just puts back the faulty file or one with missing content.

Despite this weakness, such "mirroring" backups should be **one** part of your overall backup system. I use a great **free** program "Karen's Replicator", and there are plenty of others.

Incremental backups should be another part of your overall backup system. These make copies of changed files but keep several (or many) versions of past versions so if you find a problem, you can go back file by file until you find the one that has the content you expect or need. "Cobian Backup" is a great **free** program for incremental and full backups, with lots of configuration options.

For example, I prepare the Reel Talk progressively through the month, and if I need to look at or use the version as it was 2 days ago or 10 days ago or whenever, they are all just simple five second jobs. Contact me if you'd like more to know more.


