JANUARY GENERAL MEETING:

President George Holman presided over the January meeting and welcomed new member David Risbey Junior and presented him with his badge.

Treasurer Dennis Green reported that an Audit had been prepared for the first six months of the club year so that we may apply for a grant through the Recreation Council.

Selwyn Bessell Browne expressed his protest over the claiming of records for sharks caught in Frenchman's Bay, Albany. He felt that these sharks gorged on blubber and half stupid were not a fair catch.

The Christmas social was discussed with some member raising the point about the 'bring a plate' request. It was generally agreed by most members that it was a good idea and that the evening was a success. The President urged members to support all our social committee functions and explained that all proceeds of the years social events would be used to subsidise the annual dinner dance and the more members support these events the less the annual dinner would cost them.

The policy of the Club to pay the Nomination Fees for club members representing the Club in open competitions was raised. Dennis Green advised members that the cost to the club so far this year was \$21. The Committee was asked to review the matter again and report back to the next meeting.

Dennis Green reported that Bob Klein had volunteered to go back through the Minute Books and find out exactly what the building fund rules were and what was the true intention of the founders of the fund. This is obviously going to be a huge job for Bob but he will report back to the club in due course.

George Holman reported on attending a meeting of the Recreation Council call for the purpose of discussing the "Off Road Bill". It appears the Shire want a total ban on all vehicles off the roads. Clubs etc would then have to seek permission to leave the road in their areas. The Fishing Clubs are asking for the beaches to be left open for all vehicles with access to the beaches provided. Everyone wants some form of 3rd party cover.

Petitions to the Premier will be circulating soon via clubs and tackle shops etc asking that the beaches be left open for fishermen. Watch out for them and make sure as many as possible sign them. Country Clubs can get forms through their A.A.A. Delegates.

Fishing Reports:

Bill Morrow reported on a trip to Cape Cuvier and told of using Salt Water Fly for the first time. They were really on so Bill said and in fact they used rigs with barbless hooks so that fish could be returned to the water unharmed everyone having caught more than enough. (We could do with a few field days like that!!)

Ted Savage pointed out that the amateurs fishing license included Prawns & Crabs but these were seldom mentioned and asked if anyone had

been catching any? Some of the members had been catching crabs but were a bit cagey on precisely where!

Darryl Retallick reported that a Slimy Cod of about 5lb and a Kingie about 30lb were caught in a prawning net in the Greenough River.

Neville Risbey reported on a trip to Malaysia and told us a little about the fishing up there. The fish he saw being sold in the markets were all undersize by our standards. (Perhaps our fishing is not so bad after all.)

JANUARY FIELD DAY: 17/18th January - Greenough River

Reports of fish in large quantities by members fishing this area over Christmas really got members buzzing about this field day and good hauls of tailor there last year really made this one seem promising.

Waiting for Trevor Stam to pick him up on Friday night at six o'clock, A.F.D.O. had all his gear together out on the street and locked himself out of his home. Sitting on sleeping bag got rather comfortable, so he decided to stay there - until 8.15 - (Trevor was a little late, 2½ hours). Lucky the cans were cold to keep him company.

Trevor and A.F.D.O. arrived at Ric Rowlands and John Reely (V) half full (they had been waiting too).

Our party finally got under way with Trevor taking the wrong turn on the very first corner.

MONTHLY CAST:

In warm sunshine, blue skies and variable winds, 19 happy regulars greeted each other for the first cast of '76. Attendance for this meeting was lower by 3 with the absence of Hewie, Lofty and Darryl- drawn by the sting of the angling bug to various locations north of Perth. Although all three of these sterling competitors were missed, the latter's absence was especially noticeable to Tony and Robert in that Tony performed slightly better than usual, and Robert, lacking incentive to win, slightly poorer. A.D.C.O. noticed envious comments uttered by casters as they filtered past a yellow L.W.B. 4-W.D. obstacle restricting the entrance to the arena. Recently acquired by an eminent casting official, the vehicle drew comments such as: "filthy capitalist", "did ya stretch and paint it", or "he's gonna drive y'r other one", and from its owner on discovering a few hands buried under the bonnet- "I'm watch'a ya".

A visit from noisy Noel Knight helped to brighten up proceedings considerably. There were two casters on the dry who dented the targets- B. Leicester in S/H event and the ever consistent T. Fuller in D/H Accuracy.

The L/S distance was won by G. Baskerville 35, second E. Parker 37 and third G. Holman 38.

In the D/H Accuracy, when everyone was cursing the wind, George went quickly about wrapping up the event with some very accurate scores: D/H Accuracy- G. Holman 63, B. Leicester 53 and G. Baskerville 46.

S/H Accuracy, the only event in which George's aim was army, was won by B. Leicester with 26, T. Richardson with 24 and Rudy and Gentleman Jim tying with 23 apiece.

A Single Handed Open was staged with only a few remaining to contest it- best casts: G. Holman 59m, D. Latta 73 and T. Richardson 71m.

The Senior Dry Winner was G. Holman with 125 points and the Junior Dry Winner with the very creditable score of 89, was R. Lerch Jr.

The next cast will be held on the 1st February.

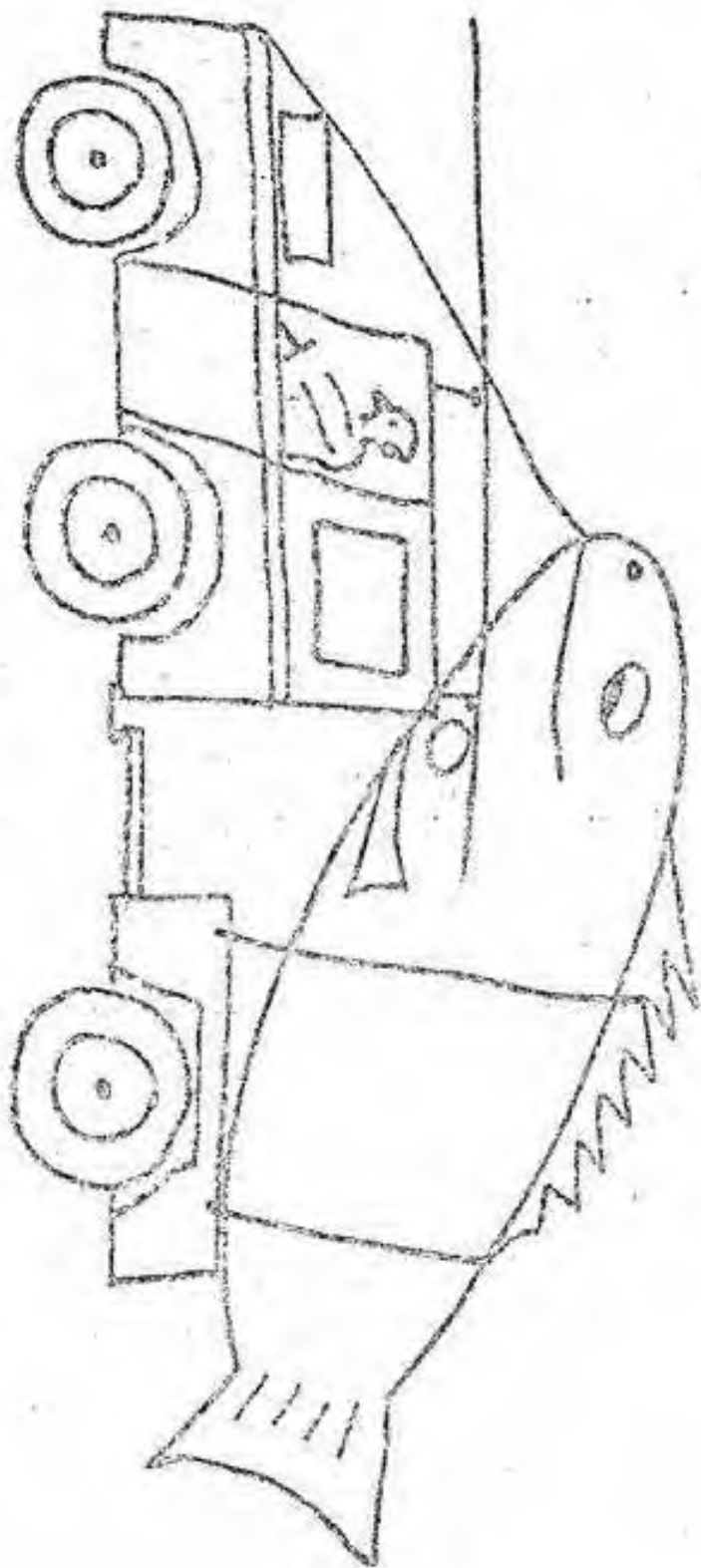
