DECEMBER FIELD DAY REPORT: 17/18TH: WEDGE ISLAND:

We had an attendance of 34 Seniors, 3 Juniors and 5 Visitors for this field day. Of these 42 fishermen and women only 24 weighed in any fish for a total of just under 60kg of fish.

The winner this month was Ric Rowland with a total of 8.85kg of assorted fish. This bag also constituted a bag of tailor weighing 4.65kg and thereby changes Section 12 accordingly. There is also a change to Section 2 for the heaviest scale fish for the second six months and this was a 2.4kg Mulloway caught by Ken Jones. Whilst on the subject of the Jones' family- Derek won the Junior Section of the field day with a bag weighing .9kg.

Alan McLaughlan kindly donated a Car Vacuum Cleaner to be presented as the F.D.O. and A.F.D.O. wished. It was decided before the sign on that the Cleaner would be won this field day by the person weighing in the heaviest bag of tailor and that it would be presented to the winner at the weigh in whilst all the members were together; and, as earlier stated, Ric Rowland weighed in a bag of 4.65kg of tailor, so he went home, not only with a feed of fish, but also a vacuum cleaner to help keep the interior of his car clean! Our thanks again to Allan for his kind donation.

Quite a few travelled up to the site Friday night to have an extra look around, but a lot seemed to meet up at the Lancelin Inn on the Saturday morning. A few left from here to make their way up to Wedge by the beach, rather than put up with the rough track the other way. Unfortunately, the beach was very soft and a few found themselves bogged up in the Lancelin area. They eventually made it through, a bit hot and sandy, but all in one piece!

Fishing on Saturday night seemed to centre mainly around the South Reef area, but a few did try their luck further north, unfortunately with little success.

We extend our thanks to Trevor Stam for taking the trouble to mark the track into Wedge on the Friday night for the benefit of members who did not know their way in.

A reminder once again please about the use of flags at all times whilst on the tracks and also, no open fires as there is still a complete fire ban in operation.

Hope to see a good turn up at the next field day, which is again at Wedge Island.

Mr. Jones purchased these waders from West Nets Sports Store and returned these waders 6 months after purchase. He claimed that they had only been worn once. Presuming this is correct he then stored these in a cupboard at home and the next time he went to wear them he found that the leg had perished. He felt that he was entitled to a new pair. We felt that the 6 months lapse in time before returning these was far too long. Also there could have been a number of factors involved in making the waders perish. Did he put them away wet? Mr. Jones contacted me and asked why we would not replace his waders for him. I told him that our firm considered that 6 months was too long a time for him to be making his claim. At no time did I ever say to him "Stiff cheese, buy a new pair".

After speaking to me Mr. Jones went back to West Nets Sports Store and was offered another pair of our waders at Cost Price. Mr. Jones declined this offer. I personally feel that West Nets Sports Store were extremely generous in that offer.

We would like to see this letter published in your publication in defence of the stand that our firm took.
