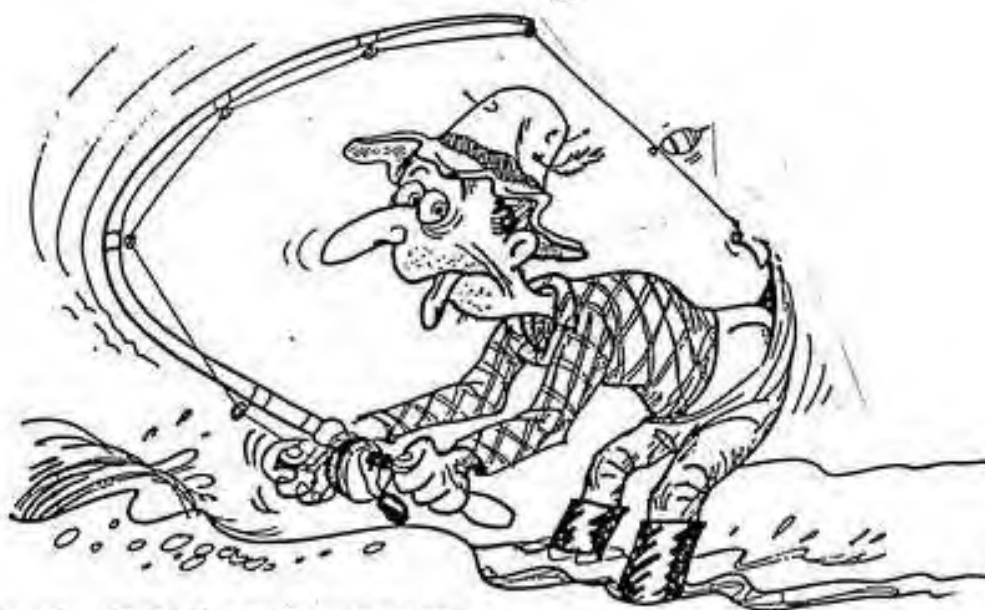
YELLOW PAGES UPDATE

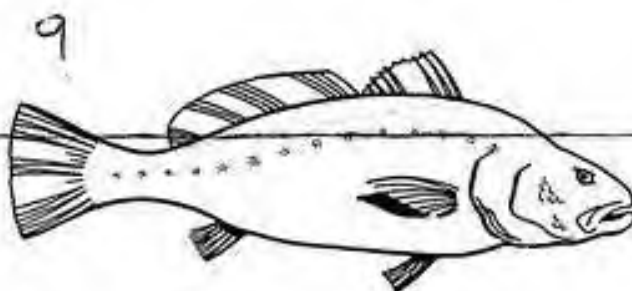
