SOUTH COAST SOJOURN:

The most unpleasant task of the week was disposing of the half kero tin of fat and crackling that Trevor conned me into carrying for him. Goodness what a revolting sight it was. Even the seagulls were staggering after partaking of it.

Friday was my day to return to Perth. It was the coldest day of the week, but still fine and I found it difficult to leave such an attractive spot and return to the busy world.
