RECREATIONAL FISHING LICENCE FEES:

A fishing licence is needed for the major recreational fishing activities of marroning, netting and rock lobster fishing.

A licence is not required for taking prawns, redfin perch, barramundi, cherabin, freshwater cobbler or trout although regulations relating to bag limits, minimum size, method of capture, closed seasons and closed areas apply to these species.

Licence fees are set according to the major fishing activity requested. The fees are \$6.00 for netting, \$6.00 for marroning and \$8.00 for rock lobster fishing and are cumulative if more than one of these activities are undertaken.

QUOBBA STATION TRIP

On the 1st May, 1987 nine of our club members set off for the Quobba Station trip which had been organised some ten months previous. The weather was slightly overcast and some drizzle was experienced.

Three Toyota Landcruisers with trailers attached were the transport, carrying everything but the kitchen sink. Ian Cook had Dick Stevens as his passenger; Eric Parker took Malcolm White and Eric Bombardieri, and I took Dave Maxstad, Malcolm Head and my son Heath. Dennis Green was all set to go but had to pull out at the last minute because his father was terminally ill. Mr. Green senior passed away on the 9th May, and to Dennis we all extend our sincerest condolences.

We travelled at a leisurely pace and arrived at the shearers' quarters at Quobba Station at approximately 1.00 pm on the Saturday. The overcast condition followed us up there and we experienced drizzle until the Monday morning.

After unpacking we went and had a quick look around and a quick fish but came back empty handed.

Sunday morning we fished near Whistling Rock with young Heath being "top dog" landing a 10 kg cleaned spotted cod. Eric Bombardieri caught a nice pink snapper on a balloon rig and the rest of the bag consisted of dart and stripies. A few of us got busted up on our big gear but the hard luck story of the morning went to Malcolm Head who had his game fish badge spanish mackerel on the ledge at the base of the cliff. The ledge had a lot of old line cluttering it up and as a result Malcolm's rig and fish got caught up and before the gaff could be set the fish fell off and was washed away. A packet of Kleenex tissues was then used!! Eric Bombardieri lost a shark at the gaff also.

After lunch we prepared to venture off to fish the field day. Eric Parker and Ian's crew went to Bluff to fish for snapper and my crew went to the Windmill area but on arriving found that the plug had been pulled out and there was very little water over the reefs. We only managed 3 snapper and Eric's crew went back to Whistlers but didn't do any good at all. Light rain and drizzle fell heavily all day.

The Monday morning saw us all back near Whistlers gas ballooning and spinning. Malcolm White lost a couple of good fish on balloons as did Eric Bombardieri, Eric Parker, Cookie and Malcolm Head. Malcolm Head later managed another spangled emper and yours truly had the embarrassing situation of having a Trevally on lure and a

shark on ballooning gear at the same time. I elected to stay with the Trevally (which I duly landed) and young Heath had a go at the shark but eventually was cut off on the ledge at the base of the cliff after a torrid tussle. I also had a Queen fish on the ledge below only to have my lure fall out and then watched the fish get washed away. I managed to catch another Trevally, a Borracoute, and a Dart on lures for the morning and lost a few more as well.

The Tuesday saw us all back at Whistlers gas ballooning and with more sob stories to tell. The most successful for the morning was Malcolm White with a nice shark. Young Heath, Dave Maxted and Malcolm Head were giving the Dart and Spangled Emperors a hiding.

On Wednesday things were a bit quiet so we split up and Eric Parker and Ian Cook and their teams went to Camp Rock for a fishwhilst my crew went to have a look at the caves area. Those that went to Camp Rock had a lean time of it.

I was advised to instruct my crew to take the barest amount of gear down the steep slope but we still managed to have a bit too much gear in our back packs. They call the hill "cardiac hill" and we now know why - very steep, shaly with loose rock surface and about 300 to 500 feet high. The actual fishing area is terrific and I managed to catch a shark mackerel after nearly loosing it to the biggest cod I have seen. As darkness drew near and after we all just about cast our arms off, we set off up the hill. Young Heath and Dave Maxted set off first with Malcolm Head and myself dragging up the rear. We all had too much gear and Dave was no exception - back pack, rods in one hand and a bucket in the other. Rather than walk around a six foot drop off Dave took the shorter route and jumped down..... rods hooked on rock... Dave lands awkwardly on right ankle...resulting in one fractured ankle. The worst was yet to come for Dave as there was no way we could carry him up the hill and after we climbed up and unloaded we came back down and helped Dave up as best we could. He litterally hopped and crawled his way up and never complained.

Back at camp a hot shower and after bathing the foot, Dave was more comfortable but Dave was not content with that he had to go one better. He became a one-legged Kangaroo and hopped around everywhere. Now the doors in the shearers' quarters are small than normal and Dave, being around six feet tall, ended up in conflict, for as Dave hopped through the door he made a large impression on his head and doctor Eric Parker then had a patch-up job to do.....a walking (or hopping) disaster area!!

That night we all gave the area close to the homestead a good hit and managed a reasonable number of spangled emperor and stripies. Dave Maxsted hobbled out over the rocks to fish also and managed to catch a spangled emperor.

On the Friday morning I was the most successful capturing a 14.25 kg. cleaned spotted cod on a balloon.

Other than the fishing the evenings back at the shearers' quarters were very enjoyable and we were even entertained with some riders on fishing by three young chaps who virtually live at Quobba. They fish there for three months each year. Everyone hopped in and helped with the chores and this made for a most harmonious time. Eric Parker put on the cook's cap and had plenty of helpers each evening...the rest had to do the washing up. However one night Dave, Heath, Malcolm Head and myself got back early and we decided to give the cook a rest and had the meal ready by the time "the rest" arrived back. Have you ever seen sixteen stone, six foot four cook throw a "bluey"? He cooled down later after sampling a number of different types of liquid!

Malcolm Head was our alarm clock, a nice one I must admit as he had the kettle boiling and toast going before he woke us up.

Dick Stevens was at his best in the evenings getting organised and organising! He also had a very special breed of liquid in a bottle tucked under his arm which he very kindly shared with us all.

Ian Cook never seems to sit still he is always doing something and doing it quickly. He really sorted out his new diesel Landcruiser on this trip and I think he is more than happy with it.
