A.A.A. REPORT:

Inward correspondence included mention of our letter offering to run the State Open Dry Casting Championships for the General Public on October 29th. The President of the A.A.A. later expressed his thanks for our offer and was pleased to accept our assistance.

While on Dry Casting; thanks were given to Ric Parker for making some dry casting sinkers for the Club Championships on 26/6/77. Entry forms for nominations will be sent out shortly, nominations close on 20/6/77. The teams are to be made of Mens: 6 with 2 reserves. Womens: 3 with 1 reserve and Juniors: 3 with 1 reserve. The final selection of the team competing is to be handed to the Dry Casting Officer of the day by 8 a.m. There was a request that trophies held by Clubs from last year be returned prior to the event. Let's hope they can give the Men's trophy, which we won last year, back to us.

There was a Coral Trout of 4.772kgs caught at Wagoes passed as a record.

The State Rock and Beach Championships are due to be run in the Yallingup area. The projected date is Sept. 24th; the event being run by the Fremantle Angling Club.

The Annual A.A.A. Convention is to be held at Bunbury on November 26th. The Bunbury Club having offered to run the affair.

There was quite a lot of discussion on the Queensland Convention in July and a proposal was accepted to subsidize the participants; \$2,500 being allocated, of which, \$2,000 is profit from the Albany Convention of 1975; the remainder coming from the profit from the Preston Beach Competition last February.

One of the Delegates, Laurie Birchall, told of a contact he had had with a Marine Biologist from South Africa, who was eager to talk and meet with Club Anglers. A suitable instruction period at one of our meetings will be arranged.

MARGARET RIVER FIELD DAY: MAY:

After breakfast Saturday morning, A.F.D.O., George Holman and Eric Parker cruised leisurely around the nearby beaches and happened upon Stan and Len busy feeding mulies to herring and skippy in the little bay around the corner from Neeralup Beach (the boat ramp). Once we had signed on, we returned to the beach we fished the previous field day to find John and Graham Reeley, Tony Richardson, Keith Wilkison and Gordon Thompsitt already encamped.

In the afternoon, that much maligned fish, the herring, saved us from empty bags and embarrassment by turning up in plague proportions. At dusk John and Tony both had hefty strikes; however, Tony's fish came unstuck, giving John the honour of beaching the only big fish for the evening. George too, hooked a very good fish, but alas, due to incompetence and a belated retrieve, A.F.D.O.'s line fouled George's, causing a loss of face and fish respectively.

Next morning, George, Ric and I emerged late from our tent, all stricken with ailments probably incurred from and encouraged by the damp, cold conditions experienced during the night. We decided to forget breakfast, and so with Ric looking on, George and I trekked wearily out to the point at the river mouth and a short while later returned bearing empty bags and stomachs to match.

Back at the weigh in, a fine array of fish was displayed.

Everyone caught herring of course and some, like Basil Marsh, caught skippy; Brian Rowland's a shark and whiting; Barry Wadhams two mulloway; John Reeley one mulloway and Eric Parker's nice tailor were a random sampling of some fine bags. Surprisingly, the salmon of which I spoke previously, didn't turn up.

I was present when John Reeley gutted his mulloway and in its stomach were the bodies of six nice sized herring and a parrot fish, so for bait for southerly kingies sought during winter, a slab of freshly caught herring would seem to be in order.

After the weigh in, Ken Jones related to me an incident which makes me think I'm becoming a bit soft. On Saturday afternoon about 4.30, Ken and son Derek were fishing just back from the point at the river mouth, when two blokes approached. "Catching any?" they enquired. "The odd one" retorted Ken. As they passed Ken noticed that they were clad only in short sleeve shirts and shorts and carrying a tripod apparatus with a yoke attachment supporting two buckets. Curious, Ken walked to the point and watched them walk almost round to the rocky promontory where they proceeded barefoot onto the reef in water up to their waists. They then set down the tripod affair and from one bucket they produced burley and fishing lines and began handlining skippy and herring, putting the fish they caught into the other bucket. That's what I call earning your fish!

Prior to the weigh in at the car park, we were all sitting in our cars, fogging up the windows waiting for the rain to ease, when two guys and a girl began to swim and jog along the beach. Nothing wrong with this except that at the time it was wet, windy and cold and all they were wearing was bathers and bikini. Anyway they hadn't run half way around the bay, when the girl turned and started back, eventually walking right past a dozen or so club members' vehicles. Now this girl was beautifully put together and as she passed by, hands wiped peep holes, windscreen wipers flicked on, windows lowered, doors opened, heads popped out and eyes goggled. Maybe we could award a trophy to her for the biggest something or other- as payment for such a splendid floorshow.

I think Margaret River will remain on the list of field days for a long time to come when anglers can catch bags such as were caught on this field day.

MARGARET RIVER FIELD DAY: APRIL:

A.F.D.O. travelled down with family on Friday night and were welcomed by Holman & Co., with whom we shared a chalet at Prevelly Park. Next morning we explored the reefs and beaches adjacent to the Caravan Park and found that most were fishable; however, we decided to fish down at the end of Blue Rock Road; i.e., the next point north of Boranup Rocks.

When we arrived the water was fairly stirred up but still fishable. Camped also in the same area we were pleased to find John and Graham Reeley, Tony Richardson, Keith Wilkerson and Robert Ingram. We all fished with only moderate success (a few herring each) until dark.

Shortly thereafter, Tony and the Reeley Bros., decided to fish the other side of the point when it was remembered that this field day last year, John caught a couple of small kingies in the same spot. In what seemed like only minutes later, we could just barely discern the outline of a couple of blokes dragging something toward us. As they drew closer, we could see one was Robert Ingram with a gaff stuck in a beautiful big mulloway, whilst the other was the fish's captor, John Reeley and in the last fading light of day, could be seen the broadest grin you could possibly imagine. Straight after this, Keith had a strike and lost it, followed by your's truly with the same result.

After another hour or so the lack of success and a cool breeze drove us back to camp.

Next morning the water looked magnificent but yielded only one salmon and as many herring as one wanted. As we were packing up, we were treated to the sight of bait fish, 400 yards or so from shore performing flying fish antics in their frantic efforts to escape from a school of big tuna which were performing in an equally spectacular manner in trying to catch them.

Back at the weighin, herring were the most common species with the odd salmon and skippy and of course John's big kingie. Whilst the weighin was in progress a pair of binoculars was produced and trained on a slow moving black patch, about  $\frac{1}{4}$  of a mile out to sea.

Closer inspection revealed it to be a huge school of salmon, the dimensions of which could only be measured in acres, obviously moving toward the spawning grounds around Naturaliste. So if we get a good blow between now and the next field day to break up the schools, some great sport could be had by light line addicts and those wishing to tie onto a noah.

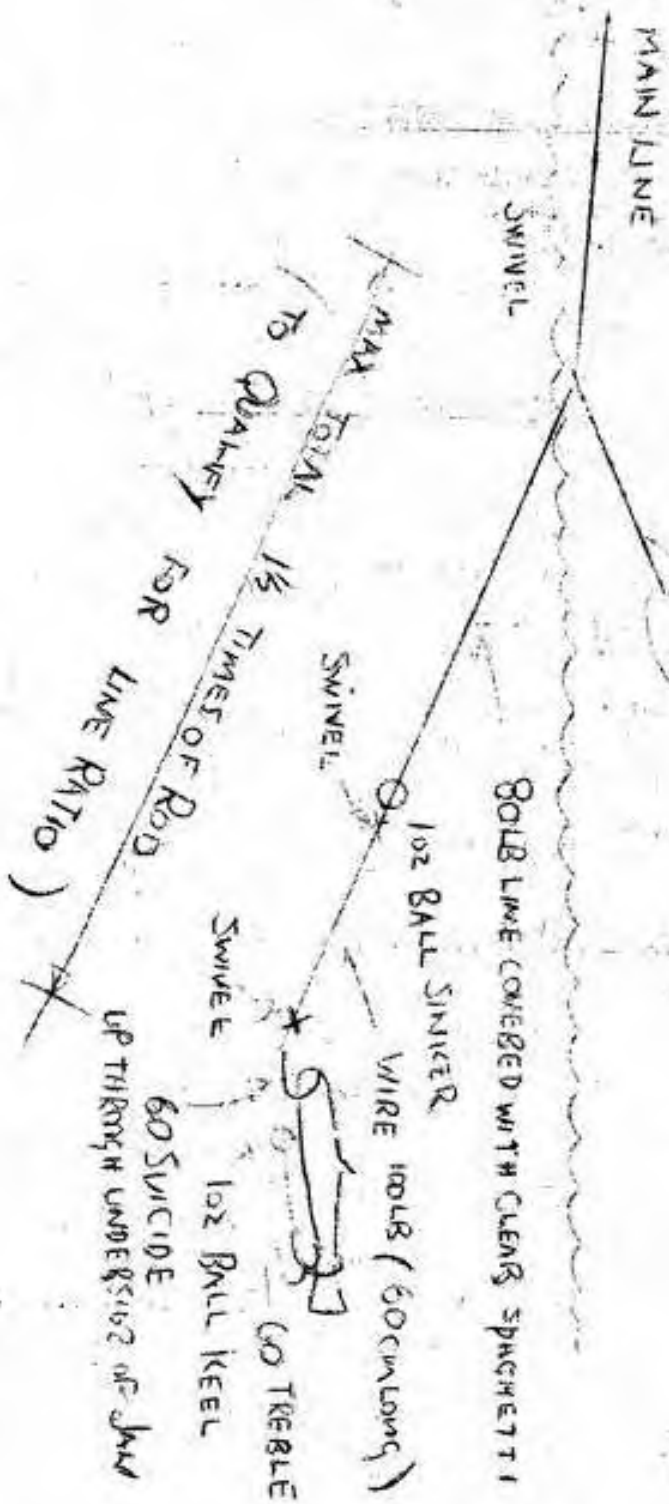
