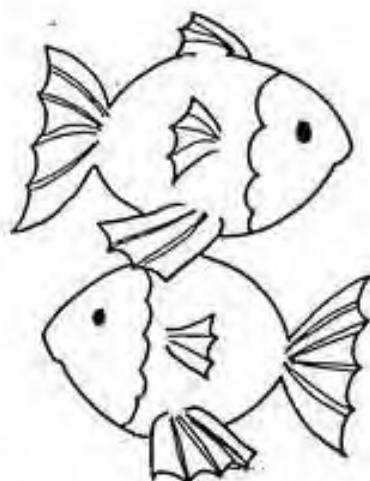



FIELD DAY REPORT

VENUE: CAPE LEEUWIN FIELD DAY
DATE: 14TH/15TH MAY 1988

When we arrived in Bunbury on the Friday night the weather was stormy with gale force winds (gusts 48-55 knots) with forecasted 8 metre waves. On the strength of this the Bunbury club cancelled their field day.

The Cliftons and a group of others including myself went to the Bistro at the Lord Forrest for dinner and had a superb meal in beautiful surroundings. I would highly recommend the place.

Saturday dawned with strong winds and rain from the W.S.W. so with some misgivings we headed for the 'sign - on' at busselton. After signing on the major group headed towards Cosy Corner while we went to look at Yallingup (wipe out). Next stop Little Ingi and Surprise, and to our surprise we found that we could get onto the rocks easily without a swim. With the wind and the rain behind us the conditions for fishing were quite comfortable. The afternoon produced salmon, snook and herring. Deciding that it was to bleak to camp out overnight we booked in at Yallingup Caravan Park in an overnight van.

Sunday showed only a slight improvement in the weather and after trying Yallingup we fished Little Ingi again. Nell a caught some nice bream, snook and herring. A group of acrobatic dolphins turned up for a time.

The group who headed for Elephant Rock (Reeley's, Cicchini's, Sid, Peter and Derry Barber) had a mixed time fishing in unpleasant and hard conditions. Brett Reeley hooked, played and landed a very nice Bonito. Well done Brett!

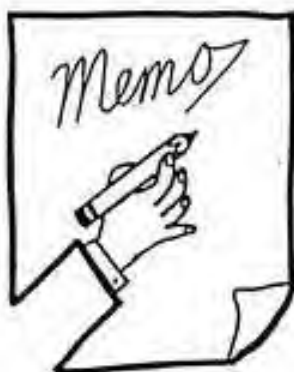
I hear John would make a marvellous Sergeant Major as he could be heard 300 metres away doing a great job of organising the boys and keeping them in line or out of trouble. A Leopard Shark caught by the Cicchini boys was a highlight of the afternoon. Peter caught a Silver Spot Kelp Fish on his heavy gear (5/0 hooks) while night fishing in blustery conditions. Sid Whiting had the misfortune to lose a nice snook/pike at his feet. During this time Derry Barber was catching herring, buff bream, sweep plus other assorted fish.

Some other brave souls fishing nearby showed Peter a new type of herring rig. They remove the feeder tube from a standard kitchen type spray bottle. This is threaded over 8 feet of leader with a single hook attached. Using a blob the method is casting and retrieving on a continuing basis. This proves to be very successful as the two buckets of herring they caught demonstrated.

Tony and Philemena were not sighted, it may well be that they fished Mosses. Bill Utting and Basil Marsh fished Eagle Bay and caught some whiting.

The field day was most enjoyable in spite of the weather and proved that perserverance will often be rewarded by good results.

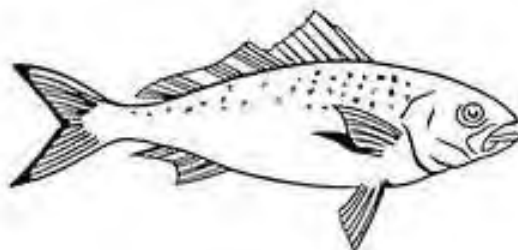

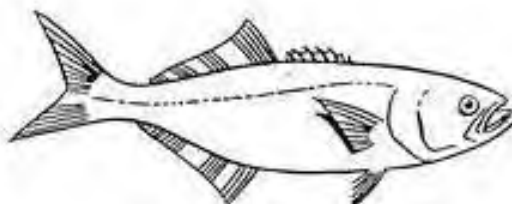

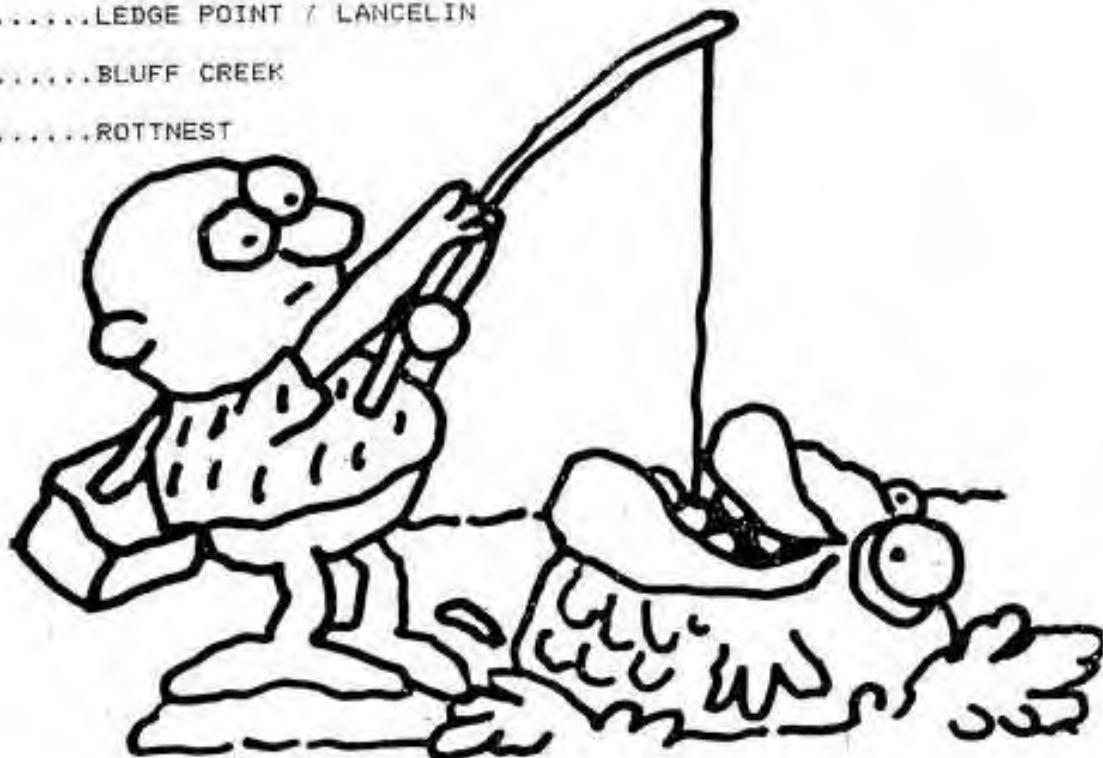
