One of the proposals I heard of was that all vehicles should be banned (other than on made roads) in an area of coast from Gilderton to Walpole up to 25 miles inland!

A.A.A. President, George Brown, has attended a lot of meetings on this matter pushing our point of view. I hope it is not a lone voice in the wilderness. Erosion of coastal dunes are a sore point at the moment and the general mood seems to be "everybody off"!!!

The Instruction Period was provided by Brian Leicester and consisted of films on fishing. Thanks Brian, for the show, you have to be keen to lug all that equipment out to Shenton Park and back again!

A.A.A. REPORT:

Our two delegates attended the April meeting of the A.A.A. W.A. Division at the Perry Lakes centre.

There was a few points that came out of the meeting to interest our members.

The Secretary reported that he attended the Environment Meeting that was organised at the University by the Community Recreation Council of W.A. to discuss the Offroad Legislation. The meeting was attended by the Ministers for Environment and Police, The Environment Control people and quite a few Associations and Clubs opposed to the Legislation in its present form. As a result of deputation put at this meeting, it has been announced that there is to be amendments to the Act as it is presented.

Peter Deeson then went on to stress the need for all those petitions to be forwarded to him for presentation to Sir Charles Court, so please get them in the mail to him or give them to your delegates as quick as possible.

The Offshore Angling Club have submitted a Notice of Motion that reads "One point per fish and four points per kilo" be the deciding factor in selecting the winner at all future Australian Angling Association W.A. Division State Angling Championships.

The Fremantle Angling Club gave notice that they intend to move an amendment to this to read, "1 point per fish and 10 points per kilo" when it is put to the delegates.

Sunday, April 4, dawning bright and sunny, developed into a beautiful autumn morning which, as the distance markers were to discover, still had an edge of the past hot summer to it.

The usual crowd, the stalwarts of dry casting, were rigging along the fence, swapping stories, pleasantries and good natured banter as well as the odd side bet. Some faces had been absent from the competition scene for a time, due to holidays, family commitments or apathy and it was good to see so many attending the end of casting for 1975-76 casting competition. Mumbles were soon heard from several sources, about the distance settings for the accuracy events and predictably there were many failures, both in practice and scoring shots. Last month's accuracy settings were also referred to as being rather distant.

To the best of the writer's knowledge, accuracy target settings for both D.H. and S.H. events are pre-set and are decided, on the day, by the D.C.O., in any order he thinks fitting. He may have attempted at the end of the season to sort the sheep from the goats by making two tough ones in a row, but in view of the falling attendances, perhaps a shorter setting at the last may have been the bait to draw next year's competitors. Who knows?

Casting mornings always have excitement, unusual happenings, advice and good fellowship and it puzzles me why more members don't take advantage of the activity to further "belong". S.C.A.C. has an enviable record of success in the dry casting field which should appeal to any competitive individual who takes pride in his prowess with rod and reel.

It may well be this very factor which deters some new and for that matter, older members from competing, feeling perhaps there is little use attending, as their abilities cannot match such high standards. In this, the competition defeats its purpose to some extent. Although a keen solid core of highly efficient competitors have emerged, the numbers have dwindled which reflecting on past casting days, seems a pity.

While some past "stars" were having a lean time, either being out of form, running dead to give others a go, planning strategy for the coming year, the "big guns" of the distance event were at their very peak. Some fine scores were produced, inspired no doubt by the glorious weather.

The morning ended with the final of the single handed open distance. This event always seems to attract a good following, perhaps because it can be contested on a fairly level footing, with all contestants using basically the same type of gear, long supple, single handed rods and for the most part, "egg beater" reels, where as a double handed open always seems to be concluded between the users of Alvey gear ups.

For some, the grand finale of any casting morning is a little refreshment and a good chat over the morning's events. These "ball" sessions are often quite enlightening in drawing points of view etc., as well as rounding off the morning with a little pleasant socialising.
