"NEW FISH HAVEN":

State Fisheries is examining proposals for up to ten more old ships to be sunk off Long Reef to build up the new offshore artificial reef there.

A second vessel- the former Navy minesweeper, Doomba, later the linseed oil carrier Meggol- has been sunk next to the old Manly ferry, Dee Why, 3.5km northeast of Long Reef, north of Sydney.

She now lies in nearly 33 metres of water, less than 200 metres southwest of the hulk of Dee Why, and sitting on her keel like the old ferry.

At the last meeting of the A.F.A.C., State Fisheries reported that latest inspections of Dee Why had shown it had already been outstandingly successful in attracting fish to a previously barren area devoid of reef. Great numbers of fish were using the wreck for shelter, ranging from yellowtail to large kingfish.

Fisheries scientists monitoring the artificial reef project say there is room for up to ten more derelict vessels to form a random reef pattern within a .5 kilometre radius of the first two sunken vessels.

They are now studying proposals for another sinking early in 1977, with more as vessels become available.

"OTHER ARTIFICIAL REEFS":

Fisheries is also to enlarge the artificial reef of old car tyres in the middle reaches of Port Hacking.

A steel barge has been built to transport another 2000 tyres up the port to the reef site. The tyres will be laid around the existing reef of 400 tyres, in tied units of 10.

The A.F.A.C. has been asked by State Fisheries to help contact amateur anglers' and underwater diving clubs for assistance in the project.

The first tyres were laid down a year ago, and it is envisaged that up to a quarter of a million tyres will be used in the reef eventually.

Meanwhile, Fisheries divers are to make a fresh survey of the four artificial reefs in Lake Macquarie, near Newcastle. More than 2600 tyres have been laid in four artificial reefs around the lake.

The Lake Macquarie reefs have served as fish shelters and habitats for marine animals for the past 7 years.
