Most of the casters were in good form with the exception of Ron Kildahl and Dennis Green who were to say the least, devastating. They both finished the day with a grand total of 129 points to make it a tie. All honours go to Ron Kildahl with a great 65' for D.H.A. and 30 for S.H.A. Dennis was obviously getting worried as he had to borrow George Holman's rod for the L.L.D. and it was only because of this that he managed to tie with Ron. D.H.A. produced some good scores this cast. Pressy Brian Leicester 65, Dennis Green 63, Graham Reeley 45 and George Holman 42. Incidentally, Graham has improved his casting drastically over the last four months. If he keeps this up he will certainly be in the top ten this coming season. Andy Tuvik is also a much improved caster.

Troy Latto won the Junior section with a total of 57 points, with Jo-anne Tompsitt just 4 points behind.

Mrs. Tompsitt, the only lady caster to attend, was of course top of her section.

Tom Armstrong our senior visitor for the day couldn't find the target in the D.H.A. but scored a good 9 in S.H.A. quite a good effort for a chap who casts very little. Harold Salfinger brought his daughter Loree along to see what it was all about and for a first time caster was certainly not disgraced. All it requires is a little practice Loree and you will soon get it all together. We extend a hearty welcome to both visitors and hope to see more of you.

Well, it's been quite a good season with an average attendance of 31 casters. We have seen two Club records broken, one by H. Hew with a cast of 157.8m in the L.L.D. Previous record was 156.6m held by John Devitt since 6/9/70. One by Pressy Brian Leicester with a cast of 147m in the 56 gram (2oz) open distance. Previous record was 136m held by Robert Ingram since 18/6/78. We have seen the introduction of ladies to our casting competition.

Our Men's Team won the South-West Drycasting Championship, our maestro, George Holman won the individual South-West Championship. Our first ever Ladies' Team was third in their division. All in all, a dam good year.

We extend our congratulations to winners of all events and sections, with a special thanks to you the casters who by your participation during the year have made our job worthwhile and have kept the Surfcasters the top drycasters.
