- 1½ lb Frozen Fish Fillets (thawed)
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon Black Pepper
- ¼ cup Marg. or Butter melted
- ½ cup milk
- 2/3 cup grated cheddar cheese
- 1 Tablespoon Parsley
- 2 Tablespoons Plain Flour

Method

Place fillets in buttered dish.  
Sprinkle with Salt and pepper.  
Pour Marg. over fillets.  
Bake in hot oven 400<sup>OC</sup> for 15-20 minutes or until fish is  
flakey when tested with fork.  
Mix milk, Flour and Cheese together. Pour over fillets  
and return to oven until top is browned, about 10-12  
minutes. Sprinkle with parsley.

APRIL FIELD DAY RESULTS - REPORT:ROTTNEST ISLAND

Magnificent conditions prevailed throughout the weekend with light winds and sunshine, smooth seas and plenty of good fish.

Although attendance was small (14 seniors, 1 lady, and 1 junior 2 visitors) the total catch of over 200 Kg speaks for itself.

Saturday afternoon the expected Salmon were conspicuous by their absence however the lack of Salmon was more than compensated for by the appearance of a school of Yellowtail Kingfish a fish not unlike a Salmon but a lot harder to coax out of the water. Whilst the majority of members were tackling the Yellowtail, just a couple of hundred yards away the rest of the happy band were putting it on a school of good tailor.

Right through the afternoon something was happening somewhere and by sundown most members were leaving the reefs more than happy with the results of their labours. Sitting in the hut having tea the room was buzzing with stories of fish caught, fish lost, screaming runs and incessant bust-offs (never seen so many people so happy about losing rigs and fish in my life). After many tales of the afternoon's excitement and the inevitable few drinks everyone settled down to sleep.

Nature called F.D.O. about 3.30a.m. Sunday and despite moving as quietly as possible (tripping-over Eddie Korins Quokka Barricade) within minutes there were people waking everywhere. Soon the billy was on and sleep for the rest of the night was a right-off. Eventually everyone went fishing and F.D.O. took advantage and went back to slumberland. Next thing Shane Smith was charging around the hut jabbering about tackle busting Kingie's and ordering himself to find more rigs.

Radar Reef looked a bit crowded by the time I arrived so decided to check out the tailor hole. Lo and behold John and Graham had found some Salmon. Joining them on the reef they supplied stories of an early run of Tailor and now had gone quiet and soon about ten or so anglers were fishing for Salmon with us all things come to an end and these fish were no exception, so most returned for breakfast whilst some returned to Radar for another try.

Sure enough the action still wasn't finished. A huge school of Salmon moved in. Brian Leicester and Tony Debarro caught their limit while Peter and Heather Osborne both boosted their bag weights. Heather finished with three yellowtail and two salmon for a bag weight of 15Kg's a fine effort by anyone's standards and especially for a junior. Other top bags by Brian Leicester (7 yellowtail, 5 salmon), T. Debarro (3 yellowtail, 5 salmon), P. Osborne (3 salmon, 6 yellowtail) J. Reeley (1 yellowtail, 4 salmon, 10 tailor) and P. Booth (1 salmon, 1 pike, 21 tailor).

Basil Marsh and Alan Stephenson declined West End to fish at "The Caves" and though their bag weights were relatively light by comparison Alan produced a great Skippy of 2.4Kg which made his weekend. This duet also indicated they had a good weekend.

I would like to thank all members in attendance for their co-operation and assistance in the running of this field day and hope you all returned home safely.

A.A.A. OF W.A.

The April meeting of the above saw both our delegates, Tony Richardson and George Holman present, along with a fair representation of other club's delegates.

Laurie Birchall has donated a perpetual trophy for the mini-juniors for the beach competitions.

The association is to purchase another trailer so that all the drycasting gear may be stored therein. This means that the large trailer is free for all the angling property and should result in less damage and loss of gear. It also means two property officers - one for general gear and the other for drycasting gear.

The motion to alter the constitution to cater for the election of a patron and the format thereof was put forward by the executive and will now go through the normal voting procedures. A previous motion from this club nominating Jim Strong for patron was noted and is carried forward to the Annual General Meeting.
