TAILOR

Preparing the Catch

Tailor must be bled immediately after catching, for example by slitting the throat.

They are best eaten fresh. Freezing or refrigeration for long periods causes loss of texture and the rather oily flesh can take on a tainted flavour.

Tailor are delicious grilled, pan-fried or smoked.

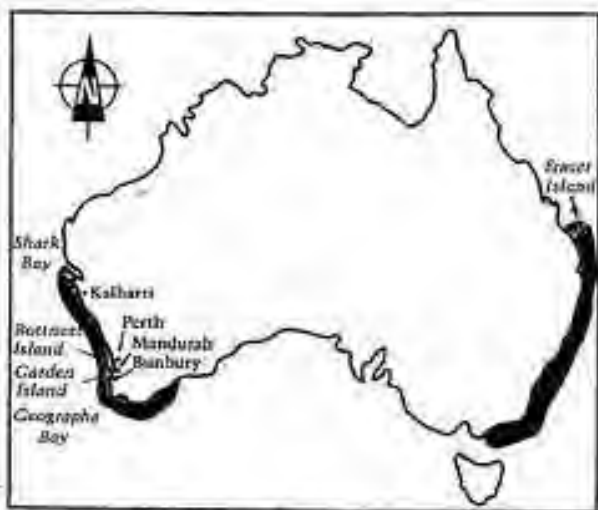
Grilled Tailor

Fillet and skin the fish.

Remove strips of dark flesh from beneath the skin if desired, as these can impart a strong flavour.

Lay the filets on foil, brush with melted butter (or herb butter) and sprinkle with freshly ground black pepper. Grill until golden (approximately 3-4 minutes on each side).

Serve garnished with lemon wedges.

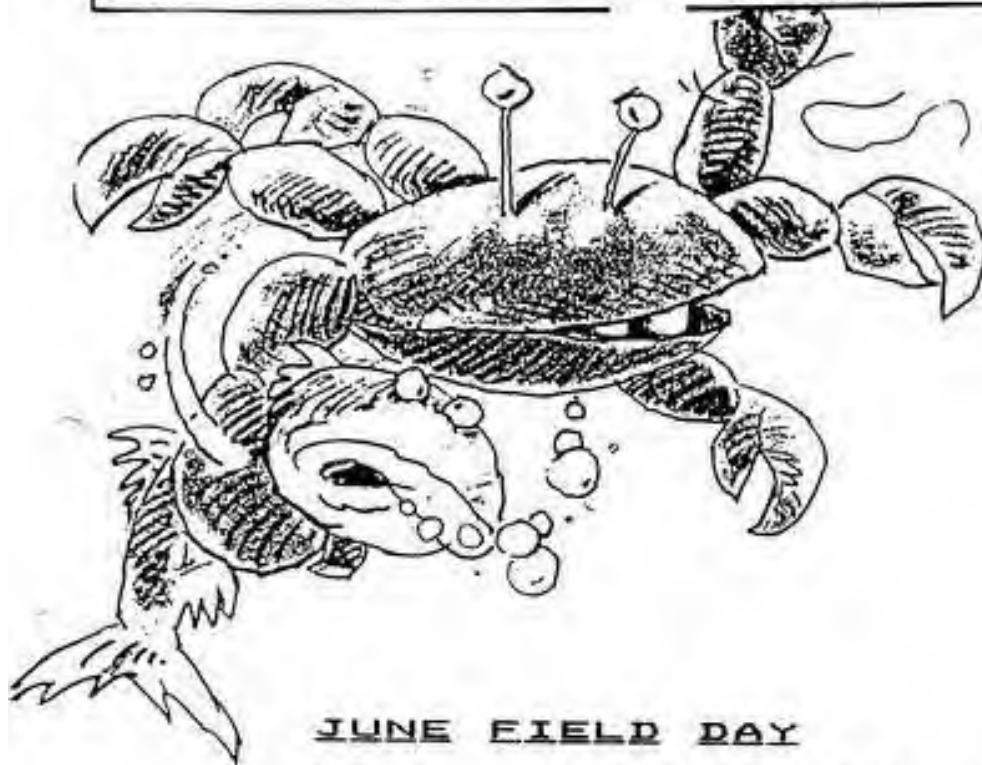
