A.A.A. REPORT:

The October meeting of the AAA of WA got off to a slow start as delegates were locked out of our usual meeting room at the Perry Lakes Stadium and went off to the Floreat Hotel where a suitable room was found.

First item was a new meeting room available at the Morley Community Centre at a nominal fee and this was approved subject to confirmation.

Teams might to be conducted at the Beaufort Hotel for State Team night coupled to a presentation of Sportsman of Year Award to Rose Harper (Bunbury) and Junior Sportsman of Year Award to Wayne Drage (Offshore); on Saturday 24th October 1982. Some other awards were also to be presented.

Mandurah Competition is starting to move but has a few problems. Date set is 20-21 February 1982. One decision made is that top award to consist of a bag comprising 3 fish only.

No Treasurer has nominated at present.

George Holman gave the report for the next State Open Drycasting at Yokine Reserve; on Sunday 25th October. Entries at that stage were down but he was instructed to take late entries on the day.

A query on Ladies accuracy drycasting from Bunbury asking for 8 casts for their event was voiced and our Chairman pointed out that we had to abide by Australian Anglers Association rules so that only 4 accuracy casts were allowed.

Correction

Recent examination of the record for the Black Banded Kingfish (*Seriolina nigrofasciata*) was determined as not being correct and is deleted from the records no previous record existed for the species therefore the position is vacant.

The Black Banded Kingfish is a deepwater pelagic species (as with Tunas etc.) Smaller but similar in appearance to the Yellow Tail Kingfish and the Samsan Fish grows to about 60cm (2ft) and has about 6 broad dark bars across the body. Distribution in W.A. is from Shark Bay northwards.
