SEPTEMBER GENERAL MEETING:

The minutes of the last meeting were read by Secretary, Mick Geddes and it was pointed out by Jim Strong that the State Fishing Championship venue was Margaret River not Yallingup.

In correspondence, a letter was read with reference to a Seminar to be held in Albany on 5th October by the Fisheries & Wildlife people on the "Salmon Fisheries". Let's hope they find some answers to our lack of salmon.

President, George Holman, reported on the A.A.A. Convention at Rockingham held on August 28th. He was disappointed at the attendance and also at the late arrival of the Minister, Mr. McKinnon. Most of the business was over when he got there and George was not able to air the clubs view on the "Off Road" legislation to him.

It seems the "HANDS OFF OUR SAND DUNES" brigade are better organised than we fishermen are- and it looks very much as though they will have their way! (The National Parks at Walpole have signs up "No vehicles past this point" at the edge of the dunes approaching Nornalup Beach!!)

The W.A. Division of the A.A.A. is the only body speaking up for us and if we cannot even attend their functions we do not deserve to maintain our access to the beaches. All club fishermen must get behind this issue. Politicians only react to the power of the voter. They will pass acts only if they think it will get votes, rather than lose them. They weigh up the losses and the gains and act accordingly. Ecology and conservation are hot at the moment and are being pushed mainly by the young voter. Both sides want to win favour with the 18-20 old voter and if a government thinks it can please more people by passing this act- it will! and the opposition will not protest. Fishermen must make their views known for them to be taken into account.

I have drafted a suggested layout elsewhere in this issue.

The Treasurer's Report dealt mainly about Lot 273 Mallard Street, Kalbarri. The property is now owned by the Club and the total cost of purchase was \$275.05 being fees etc. (Dennis has all the details if anyone wants them).

Dennis explained the idea behind the debenture issue. It is a non interest bearing loan to the club for 7 years. If all members take ONE we would pay \$1,000 off the loan and save 5 years interest on \$1,000 and pay the house off that much sooner. Then the club would pay members back their loans from rents from the house.

Get one now and get it framed for your bar; they'll make a swell trophy. One member I know has bought 5 - how's that for starters! At that rate we wouldn't need a bank loan!!!

Insurance Policies were reviewed at the last Committee Meeting.

SEPTEMBER GENERAL MEETING CONT'D:

Some of the premiums have jumped out of all proportion to the cover and Dennis explained the Club will only be renewing the Public Risk and Cash in Transit this year. Club Property cover will also be renewed.

Our A.A.A. Delegates reported on their last meeting and tabled a report setting out the fixture list for the next year and also the clubs allocated to run them.

There was much discussion on the matter, the main point being that the A.A.A. was in fact instructing us on what it thought we should do next year without first allowing delegates to return to their clubs to receive instruction on the matter.

It was the majority opinion that the A.A.A. was to always seek the clubs views on any matter before voting on it. Any new matters raised at any A.A.A. Meeting must first be returned to the clubs by delegates for the clubs consideration.

One of the fixtures proposed was on the day after our club dinner. I imagine we would find it difficult to muster much of a team of workers on the "morning after"!

Everybody thought it was a good idea to allocate different jobs to each club and "spread out the load" so to speak. But if it was put on to a club without consultation and that club failed to perform the whole exercise would be wasted.

Fishing Report.

Graham Baskerville was the only fishing report (have members become shy since I started reportin\_ them or has no-one been fishing? KAJ).

Graham prefaced his remarks by explaining that they had "knocked off a few tubes" during the afternoon and started fishing about 4.30. He went on to say they found they could get bites by reversing the mulies on the hooks. That is, tails down- instead of up! (I wonder if they knew which way they were putting them on?) They landed a good haul of 5-6 lb kingies.

On the way out they got lost, "surprise-surprise"! After a lot of scrub bashing they found an old track and followed it. After awhile they stopped at the top of a steep rise and got out for a look around. They found a 200 ft drop just over the crest!! It just shows it is advisable to take care on unknown tracks, particularly after dark.

Instruction Period.

Hew Hoy Hew gave a very interesting lecture on lures and gear to go with them. Rick Parker explained the modifications to a Mitchell Reel that he uses for this kind of work.

It was obvious that Hew has done a lot of research on this type of fishing and was able to pass on to members a lot of information we could not get anywhere else. (I guess Hew has kept a few tips up his sleeve though). It was the best instruction period I've seen for a long while and other members I spoke to afterwards felt the same.

Thanks a lot for a really good lecture Hew, I'm sure we will be asking for a repeat performance later on.

SEPTEMBER FIELD DAY:

KALBARRI HOUSE REPORT:

I'm sorry to report that no names have been put forward for the 'Hut' as yet.

Three of us went up the weekend of the A.A.A. Convention, August 28/29th for a detailed inspection.

Dennis Green, myself and Derek met at Brian Leicester's house and loaded the gear into my van for the trip. Brian had a spare door that we took for the bathroom and of course, we each included a rod in our kit, "just in case we had time to wet a line".

The trip up was uneventful except for Dennis who found the motion of my van very similar to the Islander and had trouble keeping his tea down.

At Geraldton we collected a ute full of gear (a lounge suite donated by Homecraft and a chest freezer bought by the club through Homecraft), and drove it on to Kalbarri.

After a few hours sleep we got stuck into the work. Dennis sawed the door down to size to fit the bathroom. Brian measured all the glass and listed the details for future use, and then had a good look at the painting side of things- and for good measure finished off the day with a gardening session with Derek and Dennis making good use of the borrowed ute for carting all the rubbish to the tip.

I took a drawing board up and took all the measurements of the house together with construction details and set it out in the form of a building plan.

The house consists of two "construction camp" type transportables set side by side and bolted together. Sections of the joining walls have been cut out to make an archway at one end and a doorway at the other; (all neatly done).

This gives us a house measuring overall, 40'4" x 19'10"; approx. 8 squares. Each unit is built on an "I" beam frame and sits on three concrete foundation beams. The roof is one piece "Browbuilt" metal deck laid overall both units with a barge capping forming a fascia all round; there are no gutters or down pipes. The walls are sheathed outside with Aluminium Ribbed sheets and the windows are aluminium sliding.

All plumbing and sanitary fittings are new, including septic tank and fixtures. I hope to do a small drawing I can print in Reel Talk that will give you the layout.

I write to lay before you my views on the pending "Off Road Vehicles Bill".

While I am in favour of controls over the use of "off road" vehicles both licensed and unlicensed, I would ask you to consider the needs of the amateur 'shore bound' fisherman in the community. (We cannot all afford boats).

I am a member of an Angling Club and spend a lot of my leisure time on the beaches, rocks, etc., pursuing our sport of angling.

We seek to retain access to the coast and the right to drive along the beaches, (we do not want to drive through the sandhills and scrub at large) We feel this can be done without harm to the Flora & Fauna or upsetting the ecology of the region.

The areas we fish are miles from towns and built up areas. We would not in fact ask for access to the beaches in this way anywhere near towns or people.

I set my views before you now so that when the Bill comes before Parliament you will be able to voice the views of your electors more clearly.
