OFF ROAD BILL:

A meeting was held on the 21st July with the Offshore Club concerning the Off Road Bill.

It was looked at in some detail and as a result of this meeting, a letter of protest, pointing out our objections and requirements, is now printed and circulated to all affiliated A.A.A. members via Club Committees.

You will be asked to add your name and address at the head of the page, sign it and mail it to your local member of the Legislative Assembly (M.L.A.)

We urge you all to make a point of doing this. If the Bill is passed without amendment, you will be banned from-

- 1) Travelling off the road throughout the State!
- 2) Vehicles contravening the Act can be confiscated!
- 3) Beaches throughout the State will be banned above the low water mark!

So, if you have not done so, send the letter as soon as possible.

OFF ROAD BILL CONF'D:

There was another meeting on Tuesday, 22nd August between Mr. Jeff Carr and Don Cooley representing the Government and Roy Lundy, Don Bibby, George Holman and Frank Csisack representing Clubs. The Government representatives appeared to be sympathetic to our cause and definitely take notice of representatives from Clubs.

CANVAS BAGS:

Bob Klein has received the first delivery of fishing t reel bags ordered by members at the annual general meeting. Would those members who did not collect their bags from him at the August meeting make contact with Bob or collect them at the September meeting. Any other members who wish to purchase these bags should let Bob know as soon as possible. The price of the bags is \$5.50 each for either a full circle (8 - 8½ inches diameter) suitable for Alvey reels, or half circle bags of the same size suitable for Mitchell or Dam reels.

Tool Bags (You could carry lures or spinners or odds and ends in these as an alternative to using it as a tool bag) are \$7.50 each for a bag 14" long x 3" square. Bob is waiting on the price of a slightly larger bag 14" long x 4" wide by 5" deep. These tool bags have a zip fastener along the top and have carry handles. The tool bags and the reel bags are all made of heavy duty canvas. Bug screens suitable for Toyota short wheel base Landcruisers are available at \$8 each.

- 3) Don't throw your buff bream back, it may be just the few extra points needed.
- 4) Take along a few cuttlefish to the weigh in, when things get desperate at the weigh in, they may help. Others try it, like Jim Strong.
