A little disappointing to see two mini juniors, David Richardson and Brett Reeley and two Fremantle boys (men) Bob Sparrow and friend, having to pack up the lanes while our members went their own merry way. This is a small point but one which can easily be rectified with a little bit of thought and attention to this sort of thing can only improve the camaraderie of our club.
