Entries for Game Fish Badge, Club Records and Open Fishing Competitions must be lodged with the recorder within 30 days of capture.

Another week would have been required to get anywhere near the lagoon areas around Tantabiddy and Ningaloo.

A safe and uneventful trip home marked the end of sixteen days of good fellowship, good weather, good feeling and good health. You 'gun' fisherman can have your high cliffs and rugged conditions for fishing, Exmouth has everything needed in the way of facilities, sightseeing and all types of fishing. I will go back there next year.
